The season of Lent is upon us once again. This year it comes to us a few weeks earlier than we are accustomed to. Lent represents the forty days leading up to Easter that mirror Jesus' time in the wilderness. It is a spiritual season and practice that began in the Fourth Century as a way to prepare followers of Christ for the holy day of Resurrection, Easter. It also was used as the time to prepare and disciple converts through the waters of baptism. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14<sup>th</sup> this year, which also happens to be Valentine's Day; and concludes on Holy Saturday, March 30<sup>th</sup>. In case you're doing the math, Sundays are not counted as part of the 40 days. Instead, think of Sundays during Lent as a mini-Easter. For those who give up something as part of their spiritual practice during Lent, Sundays can be considered as a free day.

#### "Faith Along the Way"



#### Stewardship – An Overview

As we enter a new year, we want to bring you up-to-date on our finances and the transition we have made with our bookkeeping. As most of you know, Carolyn Adams, our dedicated and hard-working Treasurer over the last 20 years, is off to Australia for the next 6-months. Carolyn's shoes are hard to replace, so after a lot of discussion, prayer, looking at different options and resources, the Trustees entered into conversation with the CPA Firm, MacQuigg Financial, out of Seattle. MacQuigg came from a recommendation from our Region Office of the Evergreen Association of American Baptist Churches. MacQuigg is used by some of our sister, Evergreen churches as well as by the Region, itself. The Executive Council approved the Trustees recommendation and a Letter of Intention was signed.

The other change is that Sue Shannon was appointed Treasurer. Sue will be the face or frontperson for us as a church. She will go over financial reports with the Trustees and Executive Council and will be the person to address questions at church meetings, gatherings, etc., regarding finances. MacQuigg will be our bookkeeper. Sue will be and has been working with MacQuigg during this transition. We are confident that this is the best option for us as a church community at this time. We will also be changing our bookkeeping software from Power Church to QuickBooks at MacQuigg Financials direction. If you have any questions about this change you can contact Sandi Swarthout, President of the Corporation, Russ Harpel, Chair of the Board of Trustees, Sue Shannon, Church Treasurer, and/or Pastor Mark.

We just finished up our end-of-the year financial statement. The good news is that it's mostly good news! Unfortunately, we ended 2023 in the Red (negative). The good news is we were in the Red by only -\$601. Now, you need to remember that we pay all of our 2024 Insurance premium in December of 2023. This is a long-held practice/commitment for as long as I have been here at the church. We also show that our giving/income for the year was **\$287,001.** It's important to remember that we wanted our Spending Plan to reflect our current reality and not a "we-hope-so" kind of budget. The good news is that we set our 2024 budget at \$275,00. Our giving in 2023 shows that we are in a good place, stewardship wise, and that we have growth potential to increase our spending plan for mission and ministry this coming year. We have talked about opening ourselves to being surprised by God this year. I was surprised by this financial summary. I was expecting a larger deficit. However, your faithfulness, your generosity, in being good stewards of what God has blessed you with, is humbling and fills me with optimism and excitement.

What other surprises has God in store for us this year?

I can't wait to be surprised some more!

We are entering into a brand new year full of possibilities and hope. We experienced so many changes and challenges last year.

Thank you to our congregation for supporting our annual offerings. We were blessed to support our Retired Ministers with the Retired Ministers and Missionaries Offering in December. I do hope as a congregation, we can continue to support our Global World Servants in their ministry. We have the Williams in Thailand and the Matos in Mexico. Mylinda Bates is also such a blessing for the work she does.

#### The First Baptist Church in Jamaica Plain

The Food Justice Program of the First Baptist Church in Jamaica Plain, operated through our non-profit The Centre for Faith, Art & Justice is a vital community ministry serving thousands of our neigh-



bors who face food insecurity. An effort that began as small sit-down meals on Wednesday and Saturday grew exponentially during COVID to serve 700 meals and provide groceries for over 340 households a week. And, most amazingly, this food was delivered to recipients' homes by hundreds of volunteers.

The Greater Boston Food Bank estimates that 1.6 million citizens of Massachusetts do not get enough to eat. While some aspects of the pandemic have subsided, food insecurity is not one of them. With little publicity we have a waiting list of 100 households and there are people still signing up.

We focus on serving individuals who are historically marginalized populations disproportionately impacted by food insecurity and unhealthy diets, including low-income families, seniors, and members of the Latinx community. Our goal is to collaborate with partners across our city and state to provide as many people as possible with access to healthy food because we believe that good food heals.

Funds received from grants provided by America for Christ will allow us to sustain the work of distributing healthy food to our neighbors. Please give today!
