Wonder!

If you haven't seen the pictures yet, do so, as soon as possible!

They reflect Heschel's thoughts:

Awareness of the divine begins with wonder!

As the calendar turns another page and we find ourselves in the beginning stages of the month of August, where do you experience that sense of wonder? How has God surprised you lately?

I know that we can always focus on what ails us, frightens us, angers us, but if Heschel is right and our awareness of God begins with wonder, what does that mean and look like for you?

You have a whole month to look for the ways wonder...awe...surprise, shows themselves in your life and the people around you. It can be simple and beautiful. It can be surprising and complex. It can be ______?

When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars that you have established; what are human beings that you are mindful of them,

Stewardship

Well, as we hit the halfway point of our financial year (to-date), I stand amazed at your faithfulness, commitment and generosity. I realize that our expenses are down because of the impact of the pandemic, but through it all, you continue to believe that God is not done with us as a congregation and continue to give to the mission and ministry we are attempting to live out here on the corner of 9th and Washington.

The raw numbers look like this:

Year-to-Date Income (June 30th, 2022) - \$149,701.33

Year-to-Date Expenses (June 30th, 2022) - \$122,540.04

Year-to-Date Income **over** Expenses (June 30th, 2022) – **\$27,161.29**

Additionally, above and beyond your tithe and offerings to the church, you have also given:

America For Christ Offering - \$2022.00

AFC is for ministries within American Baptist Churches USA, for Home Missions

One Great Hour of Sharing - \$3347.00

OGHS is a multi-denominational offering that goes toward Disaster Relief Efforts, globally.

This year, we have earmarked our OGHS giving to Ukraine Relief Efforts.

Again, I stand amazed at how God works in and through us...How it feels as if God is preparing us for something sustainable, amazing and significant in the near future.

August also signifies that our Budget/Spending Plan process begins. Our Treasurer, Carolyn Adams is providing the various boards and committees information on what they have spent so far this year and what their end-of-the-year projections look like. Those groups will start to discuss, pray, envision a spending plan for 2023. It's a delicate dance, but one with a lot of rhythm and occasional spice! By the end of September, the Executive Council will vote on the recommendation of the 2023 Spending Plan that the Board of Trustees submits. We will have a Budget Hearing in October for questions and/or input from you, the congregation. We make whatever adjustments might be needed and we vote on the finalized 2023 Spending Plan at the Annual Meeting in November.

Prayers for this process is appreciated and needed!

It is also a time for you to think about your own tithing process. Does your giving stay the same? Can you increase your giving a few percentages per month? For the year?

What do you feel God is calling you to do if you've never tithed before?

We are all in this process together. If you have questions, ask. If you want to know more about tithing and how to go about it, talk with Pastor Mark and/or a trusted friend within the congregation. Our giving is one way we acknowledge God's activity and blessing in our lives.
