

LIFE GROUP QUESTIONS

1. Read Genesis 6:9-22. What insight, lesson, or observation from this weekend's message did you find to be the most helpful, eye-opening, or troubling? How was your experience with the Life Tool's this past week?

2. What does it mean to be righteous?

3. How does the sin that we commit affect the world we live in and the people who live with us?

4. How would you respond if God told you to do what He asked Noah to do?

5. Is there something that God is asking you to do that seems impossible like what He asked Noah to do? How are you responding?

6. How does God's promise to Noah to save his family encourage you to trust Him with the other promises that He has made in scripture?

7. How do we remain faithful to God when life is tough?

8. How can you talk about your faith with people who don't agree with you?

LIFE TOOLS

Singles: Our obedience to God measures our trust in the Lord. Set aside time for two different actions this week. First, spend time with the Lord in prayer asking Him to reveal an area of your life where you struggle with disobedience. Ask the Lord for strength to believe what His word says in such a way that it drives you to obedience. Second, share what you are working on with a trusted mentor and ask them to walk with you as you learn to walk in obedience with the Lord.

Couples: A healthy relationship is centered on God and built on the foundation of faith. God unites us together in such a way that we help each other grow in obedience to God as we trust him more. Each of you share how God has used your spouse to grow your faith and trust in the Lord. What significant things about your spouse has brought you to be more obedient to the Lord. Then share one thing that your spouse could do that would help you grow even more in your obedience. Together, pray and thank the Lord for your spouse. Ask the Lord to use you to help each other grow in obedience and faith!

Parents of Preschoolers – 6th: Sometime during the week practice the idea of obedience with your child by having them help you with household chores. After you are finished, talk to them about how important obedience is to God and how Noah's obedience to God was what helped him build the ark that God had planned to save his family and the animals.

Parents of Teenagers: Walk your teen through "Bible Study: Covenants" found on bibleproject.com. Talk through the discussion questions in your attempt to wrap your brains around what covenants are, why God enters into them, and why He chooses those he enters them with.
