LIFE GROUP QUESTIONS

1. Read Romans 14:7-12. What was your biggest takeaway from Sunday’s sermon?
2. Read Luke 19:11-27. What are the “minas” in your life that you will have to give an account for?
3. What are the purposes of a funeral? If the primary purpose of your death is to bring glory to God. How can you work to accomplish this?
4. What have been some things you have seen at a funeral that brought honor and glory to Jesus?
5. What things are you prioritizing in your life right now that won’t matter at your funeral?

6. Read Psalm 103:12; 1 John 1:9 & 2 Corinthians 5:6-10. If our sins are forgiven, why do we still stand before God and give an account? How is this account different then the judgement of unbelievers?
8. Read 1 Corinthians 1:10 & Ephesians 4:3. How can you personally protect the unity of the church?

LIFE TOOLS

Singles: This week think about what your funeral will look like. Maybe you have it written down in your journal or will. Although you don’t have any control over *when* it is, you have a say in what you want it to look like. What songs do you want sung? What bible passages do you want shared? How can your funeral point to Jesus? He is the One who is risen, and the One who will one day raise you.

Couples: This past week Ravi Zacharais passed away. Visit and explore www.rzim.org to read his obituary and see how even in his death, Ravi Zacharais pointed others to Jesus Christ.

Parents of Preschoolers: – Use chalk on the sidewalk or crayon on a long piece of paper to trace your preschoolers feet to make a path to follow. As you walk along the path remark that everywhere we go and in everything we do we should be trying to live for God.

Parents of K-6: Glue four craft sticks together to form a square. Glue aluminum foil onto the back of the square to form a “mirror.” Write, “We live for the Lord. Romans 14:7,” on the frame of the mirror and decorate with markers. Use the mirror as a reminder to live everyday for the Lord knowing that we are accountable to Him.
