As we move forward into the month of independence and freedom, we must acknowledge the current state of what many call their home. In the past month, we've seen peaceful protests through demonstrations of the 'No King' protest, 'Hands Off!' protest, as well as other global protests that have sparked conversation around human rights. The reference to America being the "land of the brave, home of the free" has been diminished to almost nothing as the Latinx community faces frightening, unconstitutional removal from the land they believed to be safe. In my efforts, like many, to highlight the social issues that are beginning to boil over, I would like to share a few commonalities that were highlighted for me.

A few weeks ago, a friend and I were able to attend *Gaza Through My Lens - Witnessing the World Through Motaz Azaiza's Eyes*, a United Nations event that showcased and personified the meaning of humility, empathy, and terror. At the event, the Palestinian photojournalist, whose lens had not only captured the devastatingly deep siege of his homeland, as well as the beauty it once was, stirred impactful thoughts for the over 400 people in attendance. At only 26 years old, Motaz has sustained well over many life-changing experiences, ones that cannot be exhibited in their severity. Held in a church, under the gaze of God and a few angels, you could feel a hunger to learn, give, and inspire.

The crowd was heavy with a multitude of emotions, seeking to lend open ears, minds, and hearts to the victims and storytellers of the Palestinian genocide. Motaz brought up the irony of presenting in Philadelphia due to Philly being the birthplace of freedom and independence. This ironic situation brought a piercing juxtaposition to light. Gaza, long bound by blockades and occupation, remains dependent on international sympathy and sporadic aid for survival. While a Palestinian, from the heart of Palestine, speaks of the land he calls home in the city that calls itself a sanctuary. A sanctuary to whom? It wasn't one to the men, women, and children killed and affected by the MOVE bombing, the families that are being affected by deportation, nor the many plagued by acts of gun violence.

The similarities drawn between the two were striking. Both events, rooted in acquiring power, discrimination, and the silencing of resistance, echoed across time and geography. The message is clear in the connections that were formed: these aren't isolated incidents but symptoms of global systems of oppression. The parallels between Gaza and historical injustices, not just here in Philadelphia, were striking. Each story demonstrates the stronghold of state power being wielded to suppress, dehumanize, and erase.

History doesn't repeat itself, but it does rhyme. It's up to us to identify the patterns and choose to be on the right side of history. So, as we celebrate this month of freedom, we must ask ourselves: What does freedom really look like? And more importantly, who gets to live it? The answer depends on what we choose to do next. "My dream was to show you how beautiful life is... How beautiful my home is," says Motaz Azaiza.
