As schools begin to reopen and parents prepare to open their wallets, issues of financial responsibility in higher education has grown steadily. Specifically in HBCU's, where discord of financial decisions has taken place on multiple social media platforms. College students that have/are attending these schools are becoming disillusioned by the glitz and glam, and are seeking out transparency, honesty, and accountability. While HBCUs history was to educate the underprivileged and marginalized, the passion that was once there has somewhat fallen on deaf ears. In recent years the HBCU lifestyle has shifted to becoming a symbol of exclusivity and elitism rather than the refuge and uplifting community it once was. While two things can be true, these pathways of higher education are culturally vital to the upkeep of African American culture. However, the lack of concern for the needs of the student bodies these schools serve, and the mismanagement that plagued many of these schools, has caused more damage than good.

Students and families are demanding to know: Where is our money going? From unreliable transportation to inadequate housing, the concerns are not just about comfort, they're about dignity and survival. Institutions like Howard, for example, often appear more focused on protecting their image and meeting quotas than listening to the lived experiences of their student body. Adhering to student and family concerns could alleviate some of the stress of going into college. Financial clarity and institutional accountability shouldn't be optional, they should be a standard.


