## ACCOUNTABILITY FOCUS

## 1. Win Against Human Trafficking in PA

Legislation to deal with human trafficking was signed into law in July, thanks to the efforts of three State Representatives:

- HB 246, sponsored by Rep. Natalie Mihalek (R-Allegheny), prohibits defendants from introducing evidence of a victim's past sexual victimization in any prosecution.
- HB 843, sponsored by Rep. David Rowe (R-Union), requires human trafficking offenses to be considered in a parent's bid for child custody.



• HB 1147, sponsored by Rep. Valerie Gaydos (R-Allegheny), requires those convicted of human trafficking to participate in sex offender treatment programs.

Let's continue to advocate and pray for children and women, that they will stop being victimized and preyed upon. May legislation continue to support and protect women and children.

## 2. VIOLENCE

### Mental notes:

- As of August 2, 2021, in the city of Philadelphia, there have been 321 homicides (and 1,083 other violent crimes committed - rape, robbery, and aggravated assault).
- Statewide, more than 90,130 guns were sold in July; 62,056 of those were handguns. Statistics from Phila. Police crime stats and thetrace.org
- The budget passed in June by the Wolf administration will dedicate more than \$150 million to reduce violence through strategies focused on: community empowerment, employment and careers, healing, prevention, and safe havens for children and youth.



As the trauma center that treats the most gun victims of any hospital in the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Temple University Hospital finds itself on the front lines of a public health crisis that has wounded more than 25,000 Philadelphians during the past 17 years. As such, TUH has created a series of innovative outreach efforts - from violence prevention programs to first aid training to gun safety education - that aim to reduce the number of Philadelphians who suffer firearm injury. Together, these initiatives make up

## 3. Public Safety | from July 2021

Currently in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania there are 1,063 municipal law enforcement agencies with more than 22,000 officers. In July, Gov. Wolf's Administration, along with the PA State Police, announced the launch of a law enforcement reform tool to enhance hiring practices. The new electronic police misconduct database will be used by law enforcement agencies in the Commonwealth to help identify candidates with potential red flags. It is considered to be a step toward police reform, accountability and transparency.



Also for the first time in the state's history, law enforcement agencies are required to maintain and provide all employment records, including performance evaluations and reasons for separation, pertaining to a previously employed law enforcement officer to a prospective hiring agency.

The database was developed by the MPOETC (Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training Commission).

4. **Education Funding** - From Gov. Wolf re the PA budget passed in June - "This is a budget that invests in Pennsylvanians," said Gov. Wolf. "It is a budget that will help those hit hardest by the pandemic get the support they need, while at the same time making crucial investments in our future by supporting the students and workers who will drive our economy forward in the years to come." The budget outlined in House Bill 1348 makes a **historic** \$416 million increase in state funding for public education.



The budget makes crucial investments to support the needs of schools and students, including a \$200 million increase in the Fair Funding Formula, \$100 million to support underfunded school districts through the Level Up initiative, \$50 million in special education funding, \$30 million for early education, \$20 million for Ready to Learn, \$11 million for preschool Early Intervention and \$5 million for community colleges. Let's be attentive that the money is spent appropriately.

### 5. VOTING

Voter Legislation

From Gov. Wolf – July 13th-"I am proud to join President Biden in Philadelphia, the birthplace of our nation, to stand up for the freedom to vote and the sacred right to have your voice heard in our elections. Not only will I stand against any efforts to roll back our freedoms, I will continue to push for changes to take down the barriers to voting that still exist. This is a critical moment for our democracy. Some bad



actors in the state legislature and across the country are spewing lies and debunked conspiracy theories to make people question the results of the November election. These are the same lies they used to try to throw out every vote cast in the November 2020 election and ultimately caused the January 6 insurrection which shocked our nation with images of horrendous violence and destruction as a mob invaded the U.S. Capitol. Pennsylvanians believe in freedom and fairness, and I share President Biden's commitment to protecting our elections and the sacred right to vote. That is why I recently vetoed a bill that was disguised as election reform but was really about creating barriers to voting. All of us must stand united to defend the core values of our country and protect our democracy. Future generations are depending on us to rise to the moment."

**COVID-19** is still with us. And if you haven't heard, a variant of covid-19, the Delta variant, is spreading rapidly nationally. Many of us were hopefully when the vaccine became available. With the variant floating around, and many people vying not to get the vaccine, it make you wonder how safe we are in public and wonder what the implications will be from opening things back up in the city. Also, it's been a little over a month since the city dropped its mask mandate, and Philly health officials are now recommending even fully vaccinated people start wearing masks again indoors.

These are times to pray and take all that is being said into consideration. Then be your own advocate and be mindful of what you need to do to keep you and your family healthy. Be conscious that our decisions may not be the decision of others, so plan accordingly and not let our differences cause friction or conflict with others.

## COVID RELIEF

## COVID-19 VACCINES



As of July 31, 2021, In Philadelphia, at least 76% of residents 18 and over have gotten one or more vaccine doses, and 62% are fully vaccinated. Acting Health Commissioner Bettigole says there has been a small but notable rise in children covid hospitalizations. He emphasizes the best way to lower the danger is for everyone who is eligible, everyone over 12 years of age, to get the vaccine.

- Everyone 12 years of age and older are now eligible to get a covid-19 vaccination. Register at vaccines.gov. or call 1-800-232-0233 for more information.
- <u>Black Doctors covid-19 Consortium</u> is administering covid-19 Vaccines. Register at <u>www.blackdoctorsconsortium.com</u>. They can also be contacted by phone, 484-270-6200 or email: info@blackdoctorsconsortium.com.
- Check in with your local pharmacy (Rite Aid, Walgreen, CVS, etc). Many of them are giving vaccine shots.
- In the city of Philadelphia, you can register on the <u>city's vaccine interest form</u>, which will enable the city to contact you once it's your turn to receive the vaccine. People without internet access can call the city's hotline at 215-685-5488 to get on the list.
