My career in church ministry began when Polite Temple received me. When I became pregnant, my former church shunned me. As a single parent at Polite Temple, my daughter and I were welcomed with opens hearts and open arms. While attending Polite, God sent me several mentors. My former pastor, Rev. Dr. Franklin Williamson Jr. started saying to me, "I'm waiting on you." I eventually found out what he was waiting for - me to do my trial sermon. I did my trial sermon and haven't looked back. God told me, "Your life is not your own, it's Mine". Now, I am proud to be Polite Temple's first female pastor.

People would be surprised to know I love to dance. I also enjoy having a day to myself – getting up when I want to and having a cup of coffee. I also love to drive. I get my snacks together, (Herr's Kettle chips or some popcorn and coffee) – then "Let's hit the road". That's peace! And I owe it all to God, who held my destiny in His hand, who let me stray from my path, but faithfully brought me back to it.

1. WOMEN

Domestic Violence

From the Tribune: Homicides involving female victims are on the rise in Philadelphia. There was a total of 40 female homicide victims all of last year. However, from the beginning of this year, there have already been over 60 such incidents. So far this year, we've experienced 35 domestic-related homicides in our city.

If you are a young girl or woman, experiencing verbal, emotional, or

physical abuse from a male, chances are it will not stop. No matter what he says, no matter how sorry he may be. It will more than likely escalate. You MUST seek help for yourself. You can call the Philadelphia Domestic Violence Hotline at any time – 866-723-3014. The number to the National Domestic Violence Hotline is 800-799-7233; or you can Text START to 88788.

• Assaults on public transportation

There have been many assaults on women, school children, and men on public transportation, some assaults have been sexual in nature. Perpetrators range in age from teenagers to middle aged persons. SEPTA plans to hire a contractor to deploy 60 temporary security guards who will be posted at the entrances to stations along the Market-Frankford Line between 15th Street and the Frankford Transportation Center. They will not be employees of the transit agency officials said.

SEPTA also wants to assign people to monitor video feeds live "as additional eyes on the system" who can catch problems and raise a quick police response.

The Transit Workers local has also been recommending that security cameras be monitored live.

2. CHILDREN

Shootings near schools

Over the first two months of the academic year, there were at least four shootings near Philadelphia school buildings. At least 29 children were shot. Principals have demanded more support, and two efforts have been announced. Police will immediately increase patrols at 25 school zones; and the district <u>will pay community members</u> for help creating a "Safe Path." Read more about it here:

3. WHAT WILL IT TAKE TO END VIOLENCE in the City of Brotherly Love?

At least 197 shooting victims this year have been under the age of 18.

As of November 30, 2021, in the City of Philadelphia, there have been 510 homicides so far this year (and 13,105 other violent crimes committed – rapes, robberies, aggravated assaults). *Statistics from Philadelphia Police Department Crime Maps & Stats.*



Statewide, MONTHLY, more than 73,959 guns were sold **in the month** of November **2021**. **50,837** of those were handguns, 23,122 were long guns (some military-style rifles). **MONTHLY**. *Statistics from and thetrace.org*.

During the Thanksgiving weekend, a coalition called Philly Truce planned to patrol neighborhoods to combat gun violence because "our children are killing one another". • From Gov, Wolf's Weekly Newsletter:

Governor Tom Wolf denounced a move by PA Senate Republicans to pass dangerous legislation that would make Pennsylvanians less safe.

"This is a move to lower the bar for unvetted, permitless people to carry hidden weapons while they walk our streets and mingle in our communities and to dismantle the commonwealth's system for responsible gun ownership. We need to stop this nonsense – we should question why we would want anyone who hasn't undergone a background check to carry a concealed weapon. We should question politicians who turn a blind eye to the fact that states without concealed carry permits have an 11 percent higher rate of homicide than those with discretion."

"I have repeatedly called on the General Assembly to act for the communities across Pennsylvania facing daily terrors of gun violence; this is not the commonsense legislation that the more than 1,600 victims of gun violence each year in Pennsylvania deserve. Pennsylvanians deserve safety. Republicans are dealing them peril with this irresponsible bill."

Gov. Wolf has asked for safe storage legislation to reduce the number of shootings by people who should not have access to guns, including accidental shootings by children; to tighten reporting requirements for lost or stolen guns; to swiftly pass the Extreme Risk Protection Order Act, also known as the red flag law; and to pursue state-level universal background checks on all gun purchases.

The Senate is considering Senate Bill 565 and Senate Bill 448. SB 448 would allow anyone to sue a city for enacting gun safety policies then force taxpayers to pick up the legal costs. Gov. Wolf will veto both bills.

4. VOTING POWER

From Vote.org: Voting and the freedom to vote should not be a controversial or partisan issue. We're asking you to help as we continue to advocate for the passage of these crucial pieces of legislation. 

5. **REDISTRICTING**

Redistricting is under way nationwide, and the new maps from states like Texas and North Carolina are a grim sight. Republicans are gerrymandering away new electoral opportunities for communities of color, and in many places worsening existing ones. Thanks to an under-the-radar Supreme Court ruling, *Rucho v. Common Cause*, maps that dilute representation for communities of

color are permissible so long as the mapmakers claim they were only trying to target the opposing party. In affirming that racial gerrymandering is illegal, the Court has given partisan gerrymandering the green light. Unless the Senate passes the Freedom to Vote Act, which would ban partisan gerrymandering and make it harder for states to defend discriminatory congressional maps, this redistricting cycle could be among the worst in history for communities of color.

COVID-19

Covid-19 is still with us, along with a couple of variants. Consider getting vaxxed and boosted. If not for yourself, then for your loved ones who are too young to get vaccinated, and your loved ones who are older with vulnerable conditions.

COVID RELIEF

Philadelphians who have lost loved ones due to covid, can receive FEMA aid to cover funeral expenses, up to \$9,000 per person lost. Call 844-684-6333 to apply.

COVID-19 VACCINES

As of December 1, 2021 - 1,012,589 persons have been fully vaccinated and 265,443 have received one dose, according to the City of Philadelphia Coronavirus dashboard.

• Now that the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has given the green light to administer COVID-19 vaccinations



to kids aged 5 to 11, the School District of Philadelphia has set up clinics for children to get their shots. "We will be providing some clinics both in our schools and in other health care facilities for young people who were interested in receiving the vaccine," said Superintendent William Hite.

The clinics will be set up in partnership with the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, the Philadelphia Department of Public Health, and the Black Doctors COVID-19 Consortium. The district surveyed parents, and Hite said most wanted their children to get the shot. "Of the roughly 2,000 people who responded, 63% have indicated that they are strongly interested in their children receiving the vaccine," he said. Philadelphia residents are exposed to many environmental harms due to the city's industrial past, combined with racial-biased discriminatory policies including zoning, racial covenants, and redlining. Examples of <u>environmental racism are prominent in the Philadelphia</u> <u>area.</u> Blacks and residents of color, as well as low-income communities, are more likely to live in neighborhoods with environmental hazards and are more vulnerable to climate change.

The City officially opened the application process for the <u>first Environmental Justice Advisory</u> <u>Commission</u>. The commission will provide recommendations to the Mayor, City Council, and Office of Sustainability for how to study and address environmental justice issues in Philadelphia. Residents – especially those from impacted communities – are invited to join the Commission. Applications are open through midnight on December 22nd.

HOLIDAY SAFETY REMINDERS

During the busy holiday season, there is often a significant increase in the number of thefts and burglaries throughout neighborhoods. Please be vigilant and aware of your surroundings at all times when you are out and about.

THEFT FROM AUTO

There are a few easy steps you can take to prevent yourself from becoming a victim:

- Lock your vehicle.
- Always take your keys with you.
- Hide your valuables if you can't take them with you.
- Never leave firearms or highly valuable items in your parked car.

PACKAGE THEFT

Ordering something from Amazon? Expecting a USPS, UPS, or FedEX Delivery? Deliveries often arrive while you're at work, which makes them easy picking for porch bandits.

- When possible, try to schedule deliveries for days when you'll be home, or have a neighbor or family member pick up your packages for you before you get home.
- Consider having packages delivered to work or school, or to a family member's house when they'll be home.

Because many people buy gifts and presents during the holidays, burglars may believe that you have valuable new items inside your home to be stolen. Try to follow these tips to keep your belongings safe and keep your family from being victimized.

BURGLARY TIPS

- Be sure to lock your house or apartment before you leave. Check all your doors and windows to make sure they're secure.
- Make your house visible with **good lighting**.
- Trim any bushes or trees in front of your house.
- Consider leaving a radio or TV on when you're not home to make it seem like someone is there.
- Install cameras around your house, and make them visible.
- Consider having a **burglary alarm** installed.
- Know your neighbors. Watch for suspicious persons around their houses, and have them watch for suspicious persons around yours.
