Mr. Sigmund T. Jackson

*This month's Destiny Spotlight is on Your Destiny is Here, Inc.'s Advisory Board Member, **Mr. Sigmund T. Jackson**. **Mr. Jackson** is the co-lead for our Artistic Advocate Project with interests in Media Production, Spoken Word and the Performing Arts. The following is our interview with Mr. Sigmund Jackson.*

Many of us discover our destiny when we are young and then as adults, we prepare and pursue it, going down the road to where we believe we'll find our calling.

I am a filmmaker. The path I took started with writing screenplays (movies). One day, someone saw my screenplay and said I needed to direct what I had written. James Panette, who was my first mentor, walked me through the process of directing my first screenplay. That was how I transitioned from writing screenplays to directing and making films. It was scary at first because of all the new things I had to learn. The process of writing a screenplay and directing a film were completely different. One of the major differences I had to understand was the written words would not look exactly the same when they appeared on the screen. Also, when you're directing a film, you have to use the camera at various angles to express the message and emotions of the screen: joy, sadness, fear, bravery anger, tension, or relaxation. Again, it was scary at first, but now I find it very exciting.

Working as a film-maker gives me perspective into human beings. I'm a good listener, very optimistic and can relate with my audience. By getting feedback from people, I get different viewpoints. My films are a dramatic method to teach life skills and life lessons. I use my films to influence people's thoughts in a positive manner as with the movie "Forrest Gump", which was encouraging and had a lot of built-in life lessons.

I find volunteering with not-for-profit groups to be very rewarding. It would make a huge difference in this world if more people had an understanding of other people's challenges. I was involved with a program called "Street Therapy - Talk it Out", which began just before the pandemic hit. It was geared towards taking a stand against violence. It's mission was to involve youth in discussions, programs, and mentorships that taught life skills. Asking for help is an important life skill. THERAPY is not a bad word. Some people really do need to talk their problems out. People need to be selfish, which means self-interest, to do for yourself. So don't feel bad if you *take care of yourself*. If you're discouraged, I support your taking a look at yourself, and recognizing that something is off. Admission is the first step and then, ask someone for help.

I continue to encourage youth because they have many options for educational and career advancement; more than ever before. They also have more businesses possibilities: at home, online, in their community, or a regular 9-5 job. This is a good thing. Hopefully, they will learn to take advantage of these opportunities.

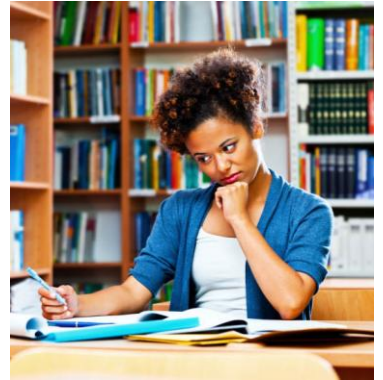

1. WOMEN

From the Office of Gov. Wolf - Newly proposed "It's On Us" legislation is to combat sexual assault on PA campuses. The first several weeks of the fall semester is commonly referred to as the "Red Zone" when sexual assault increases, especially among freshman women. More than 418,000 victims of sexual violence are under age 18 in Pennsylvania.

2. WHAT WILL IT TAKE TO END VIOLENCE in the City of Brotherly Love?

As of October 24, 2021, in the city of Philadelphia, there have been 436 homicides so far this year (and 11,479 other violent crimes committed - rapes, robberies, aggravated assaults). *Statistics from Philadelphia Police Department Crime Maps & Stats.*

Statewide, more than 83,556 guns were sold in the month of September 2021. 57,506 of those were handguns, 26,050 were long guns (some military-style rifles). *Statistics from thetrace.org posted the first of the month for the previous month.*



- **From CeaseFirePA - There are two bills that will** make everything from mass shootings to deadly community shootings more likely to happen.

1 - **PUNITIVE PREEMPTION (SENATE BILL 448)** would allow anyone—even the NRA—to sue a city for trying to reduce gun violence through local ordinances, then force taxpayers to pay the legal fees.

2 - **PERMITLESS CARRY (SENATE BILL 565)** would allow anyone over 18 to carry a loaded and concealed firearm in public without any need for a permit. This would increase the ability of untrained, abusive, or unstable people to take a gun anywhere they want. Combined, these bills will put Pennsylvanians in greater danger from firearm violence, while putting even more money into the hands of the gun manufacturer's lobby. A similar bill to SB 4448 was already passed by the State House of Representatives, and was approved by the Senate's Local Government Committee in October.

Contact your state senator now. **Oppose punitive preemption and permitless concealed carry.**

DID YOU KNOW? If your vehicle is damaged due to gun violence, the cost to repair it may have to come out of your pocket? The gun violence assistance programs do not cover third party property damage, and victim assistance is not set up to help you either.

If you have a comprehensive auto insurance policy, anything that happens to your car while parked on the street is covered. But if you only have liability insurance, that only covers damage you cause to other people.

4. REDISTRICTING affects how Pennsylvania's diverse communities are represented.

Under state law, the Pennsylvania legislature is tasked with passing a bill defining congressional district boundaries, which is then considered by the governor. The legislature will debate these maps this fall so that they can be in place for next year's primary election.

To increase community engagement with this critical process, Governor Tom Wolf has established a **Pennsylvania Redistricting Public Comment Portal** to allow citizens to provide input on the congressional redistricting process. Give Your Feedback on Pennsylvania's Redistricting.
