Pastor Jordan is a native of New Jersey, who now resides in Charlotte, North Carolina. The following is our interview with Pastor Stephanie Jordan.

My professions were the pathways that led me to my destiny. My destiny wasn't my journey, it was my destination, it was my journey's end. All Destinies are the end result of where God wants us. Picture striving towards your destiny as if you're getting ready to step onto an elevator. You have the vision of where you want to go and what you have to do to get there. You just have to get on the elevator (your path) and go up.

I have two professions and the Lord led me to both. Although I'm a Pastor, I didn't always see ministry as my profession. I liked old school rap music. However, as my life progressed, being an encourager and having great integrity, God directed me into ministerial leadership. My mentors Apostle Joe Savage and Dr. Annyebelle Neal, groomed me in leadership and pastoralship.

I'm also a baker and artisan business owner. A little over a year ago, my family and I took a big leap of faith. God lead us to move to North Carolina. My husband and I own Jordan's Culinary Creations, which is our umbrella company. There are different entities that stem from it, including Dyan's Confections, a bakery I own. I make cakes, pies, and all types of sweets. God gave me a signature recipe which has been very successful.

I love to bake, and I learned a lot about baking from my grandmother. Years ago I baked cakes at home and always felt that ministry was in me. As I work and interact alongside many different ethnicities at our local farmers' markets, baking has opened the door for me to witness to people who may not enter a church. There are several comparisons between the two and I have to work hard to brainstorm and strategize for ways to reach people in both arenas. God continues to guide me in each.

Once we moved to North Carolina, the pandemic hit. Nevertheless, I knew God was leading us and wanted this for me. I knew He would not lead me to the water only to let me sink. Where there might have been some frustration, I look at obstacles as part of the process and not as a bad thing. I had to re-discipline myself. I went from having a 9 to 5 job, getting guaranteed paychecks every two weeks, to being a full-time business owner; needing to make my own money on a weekly basis. I was forced to seriously analyze why and how I spent money. When I made money, all of it couldn't go directly into my household, it had to be reinvested with some of the profits going back into the business. I thought about Sam Walton, the founder of Walmart who failed many times in his life. He adapted and started over and eventually developed the largest retail chain in the United States. Through it all, God has exceeded all of my expectations and He continues to open so many doors.

For anyone who has lost their way or feels discouraged, get back into the game. Don't let others define your success. Allow God to minister to you. If you are a believer, ask God to renew your passion in Him. Spend time in The Word and in prayer. If you are a non-believer, accept Jesus Christ, and know there is hope in Him. Having the love of God in your heart and knowing Jesus Christ, you will make a difference in the world.

God's creation is beautiful and what the world needs is the love of God. If we were more loving towards our neighbors as we are with ourselves, a lot of the foolishness we see and experience in the world would be diminished. God's way is not the world's way. God wants to know that we are going to do what He says and go where He leads. With God leading us, we are already successful.

1. WOMEN

The Fairness in Women's Sports Act - HB 972 - would protect women and girls by ensuring that they are not forced to compete against biological males playing on women's sports teams. <u>Take action and ask your state</u> representative to support HB 972 here.



2. ENDING VIOLENCE

- As of August 31, 2021, in the city of Philadelphia, there have been 358 homicides this year (and 9,035 other violent crimes committed rapes, robberies, aggravated assaults). Statistics from Philadelphia Police Department Crime Maps & Stats.
- Statewide, more than 82,713 guns were sold **in August 2021**; 56,039 of those were handguns, 26,674 were long guns (some military-style rifles). *Statistics from and thetrace.org*.




- CeaseFirePA is leading a coalition of nearly 100 groups across Pennsylvania faith based, community based, veteran, public health, youth, and survivor organizations to support a Common Agenda to End Gun Violence. The coalition currently is focused on three policy priorities:
 - ▶ Extreme Risk Protection Orders (ERPO) aims to reduce firearm suicides, mass shootings, domestic violence, community violence and homicides. With an ERPO, family members can petition a judge to *temporarily* remove firearms from a loved one in crisis.
 - ▶ <u>Reporting of Lost or Stolen Firearms</u> By requiring gun owners to report the loss or theft of a firearm within three days of discovering the firearm is gone, this policy would reduce community violence by giving police a tracking tool to identify repeat offenders as probable neighborhood traffickers.
 - ▶ <u>Universal Background Checks</u> In 2020, PA firearm background checks rose to historic levels with nearly 1.5 million legal attempted firearm purchases. Denials climbed even faster, with more than 25,000 people denied a purchase. Currently, background checks aren't required on all firearm sales, especially of long guns like military-style rifles. This is a top-selling type of firearm that without background checks (and denials), could be slipping through the cracks into the hands of those who might commit violence with them. Background checks are one reliable way to stop bad transactions at the source: the sale.

3. VOTING POWER

- ▶ Voter Legislation
 The John Lewis Voting Rights Amendment Act of 2021, is proposed legislation that would restore and strengthen parts of the Voting Rights Act of 1965. It's meant to safeguard voting rights around the country. The U.S House of Representatives finally passed the bill on August 24th. It has moved on to the Senate for ratification.
- ▶ National Voter Registration Day is Tuesday, September 28th. If you're not registered, make this the day! register to vote.
- ▶ Have you recently: Moved? Changed your name? Want to check your voter registration status? The next election in Pennsylvania is November 2, 2021. Now is the time to make sure you are registered to vote, and your voter registration information is correct and up to date. Visit wotes.pdf.com/Register to: register to vote, change your name, or change your address. You must make any updates to your voter registration by October 18 for them to take effect by the November 2021 election.
- ▶ The deadline to sign-up to vote by mail ballot during the upcoming election is October 25th. Sign up today at http://votespa.com/mailballot. You must be a registered voter to submit an application. You can check whether you are registered to vote in Pennsylvania using Find Voter Registration Status.

COVID RELIEF

Philadelphians who have lost loved ones due to covid-19 can receive FEMA aid to cover funeral expenses, up to \$9,000 per person lost. Call 844-684-6333 to apply.

COVID-19 VACCINES



There are numerous younger children who are getting sick with what is being called, 'respiratory tract infections'. Symptoms are fever and coughing. Some people in the medical field say these are indications of the delta variant. When Covid first evolved, it was not affecting children, but it is now. If you are 12 years of age and older, you are eligible to get the Covid-19 vaccine. Please get it if you haven't, especially if you are around young children or older adults, and you travel and hang out with large groups of people. Let's all do what we can to keep ourselves and others we care about safe.

- Everyone 12 years of age and older are now eligible to get a Covid-19 vaccination. Register at vaccines.gov. or call 1-800-232-0233 for more information.
- <u>Black Doctors covid-19 Consortium</u> is administering Covid-19 vaccines. Register at <u>www.blackdoctorsconsortium.com</u>. They can also be contacted by phone, 484-270-6200 or email: info@blackdoctorsconsortium.com.
- Check in with your local pharmacy (Rite Aid, Walgreen, CVS, etc). Many of them are giving vaccine shots.
- Help combat vaccine hesitancy and myths about vaccines by sharing your vaccine experience using #GotMyShotPA on social media.

COVID-19 TESTING

Testing is being required of many people these days, especially those who have not gotten the vaccine but want to attend concerts and sporting events. Even some businesses and places of work are making it a necessity. And for people who have gotten the vaccine, if you are travelling, you may be expected to quarantine and/or be tested. Many companies are now charging for tests. Make sure you call before you go, so you're not surprised, as some tests can be \$75 or over. No-cost testing is available at certain local health



centers and select pharmacies. Call your local CVS, RiteAid, and Walgreens for more information. Also, the Black Doctors Consortium continues to do **free testing and vaccinations.** Visit their website for a weekly schedule of locations and dates. RENTAL ASSISTANCE. UTILITY HELP

Philadelphia residents who need help paying their rent and utilities can seek help through the Emergency Rental Assistance Program. The Emergency Rental Assistance Program is open to landlords and tenants. In addition, if homeowners are struggling with mortgage delinquencies and/or property tax delinquencies related to Covid-19, help is available. Also, this program helps with several utilities, including assistance with PECO utility bills.

RELIEF FOR BILL PAYMENTS

Customers who can't get into a low-income program should ask their utility company about getting a five-year payment arrangement. Instead of paying in one lump sum, customers will get five years to pay off their debt. These extended arrangements are only available until September 30, 2021.


