## **Homily Summary – Christmas (Year C)**

#### Main Theme: God's Love Made Visible in Jesus' Birth

Merry Christmas! We celebrate the greatest gift of all—Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh. Christmas invites us to reflect on the depth of God's love, a love so profound that He became one of us in the infant Jesus.

#### **Main Points**

#### 1. A Gift Beyond Words

- The infinite God became the infant God, humbling Himself out of love for us. This wonder should inspire awe, reminding us of the immense love and majesty of God.
- Just as God worked through humble Bethlehem, He works in the simplicity of our lives.

## 2. The Relationship at the Heart of Christmas

- Christmas is about a personal relationship with God. While gifts, gatherings, and meals are wonderful, they are signs pointing to God's love for us.
- o Jesus came for you. His birth is an invitation to deeper connection with Him.

## 3. The Simplicity of Christmas

- Even if this year's Christmas feels simple, remember the first Christmas was simple too. In simplicity, there is space for profound encounters with God.
- o Take time, even just five minutes, to speak with God from your heart.

## 4. Loss and Hope

 For those experiencing loss, grief, or family struggles, know that Jesus desires to console and strengthen you. His love offers peace, even in pain.

## 5. The Liturgical Season and Resolutions

- o Christmas begins today and continues through the season of Christmastide.
- Consider making a Christmas or New Year's resolution—whether it's daily prayer, reading Scripture, or attending Mass weekly.

#### 6. Signs of God's Love

Blessed St. Benedict Medals and books given at Mass are reminders of God's love. Use these
gifts to deepen your faith and hear God's voice more clearly.

#### **Reflection Questions**

- How can you make time for Jesus amidst the busyness of Christmas?
- What Christmas or New Year's resolution will you make to grow closer to God?
