Homily Summary - Solemnity of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (2025)

Overview

This weekend (at our parish) we celebrate the Solemnity of the Immaculate Heart of Mary—our parish's great patroness and mother. We reflect on Mary's heart as the very center of her being: a heart that is immaculate, burning with love for God and others, and deeply in tune with God's will. This celebration is a beautiful opportunity to ask ourselves: Do we live our faith from the heart, like Mary did?

Main Points

1. The Heart as the Core of the Person

- o The Church and Scripture often speak of the heart as the center of a person's being.
- The Catechism describes the heart as the place of decision, truth, encounter, and covenant (CCC 2563).
- o The word *heart* in French (*cœur*) also hints at this deep connection.

2. Mary's Immaculate Heart

- Protected from sin from the first moment of her existence, Mary's heart is immaculate—pure, loving, and holy.
- Her heart is symbolized as being on fire, like Christ's Sacred Heart, with divine love.

3. Mary as Our Mother and Model

- o Jesus gave Mary to us as our mother from the Cross (cf. John 19:26–27).
- o Revelation 12–13 shows Mary's role as Queen and Mother of the Church.
- o She intercedes for us constantly (cf. *Hail Mary*) and teaches us to trust and love as she does.

4. Mary Pondered in Her Heart

- o Twice in Luke's Gospel, Mary is said to have pondered things in her heart (Luke 2:19, 2:51).
- o This tells us she engaged deeply not only with her mind, but with her heart.
- We're called to imitate this: not just knowing about God, but living in deep relationship with Him.

5. Living With Our Heart, Like Mary

- Do we read Scripture and live our faith only intellectually—or also personally and prayerfully?
- o Do we surrender ourselves fully to God, like Mary did?

Reflection Questions

- 1. Do I live my faith only in my mind—or also in my heart?
- 2. What does it mean for me to truly love God "with all my heart"?
- 3. When I hear Scripture or teachings of the Church, do I ponder them like Mary did?
- 4. Have I asked Mary, my spiritual mother, to help me grow closer to Jesus?
- 5. How can I better model my life after Mary's trust and openness to God?
