Homily Summary – Christ the King 2024

Main Themes:

- **Needed and Known:** Every person is deeply known and uniquely needed in God's kingdom. Jesus Christ, our King, desires a personal relationship with us and invites us to share our talents and love selflessly with the world.
- **Humility in Service:** As Christ, the King of the Universe, modeled humility, we are called to serve others selflessly, avoiding entitlement or self-centeredness in our ministries and relationships.
- The Church as Christ's Kingdom: The Church is the extension of Christ's kingdom on earth, ruled by Him and guided by the Pope, His vicar, as a servant-leader of the people.
- **Vigilance in Faith:** As the liturgical year ends, we are reminded to live with purpose, ensuring our actions reflect the reign of Christ in our lives.

Key Scripture Passages:

- Daniel 7:14: "His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not pass away, and His kingdom one that shall not be destroyed."
- Matthew 25:34: "Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world."
- Mark 10:43-45: "Whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant."

Reflection Questions:

- 1. Do I truly feel needed and known by Christ?
- 2. In what ways do I extend Christ's reign in my daily life—at home, work, or in my community?
- 3. How do I guard against selfishness or entitlement in my service to others?
