3rd Sunday of Lent (Year C)

Main Points:

- Lent is a season of renewal, where we turn from sin and deepen our relationship with God.
- At every Mass, we are given the opportunity to repent, pray, fast, and give alms, which are key Lenten
 practices.
- The Penitential Rite at the beginning of Mass calls us to acknowledge our sins and repent.
- The prayers at Mass invite us to bring our petitions to God, deepening our life of prayer.
- The Eucharistic fast before receiving Holy Communion reminds us of the discipline of fasting.
- The **offertory** is a chance to give alms, offering financial support and spiritual sacrifices to God.
- These practices are not just for Lent but for our entire Christian life, forming us into disciples of Christ.

Scripture References (NRSVCE):

- Matthew 6:1-6, 16-18 Jesus teaches on prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.
- Luke 13:3 "Unless you repent, you will all perish as they did."
- 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances."
- Sirach 17:22-23 "One's almsgiving is like a signet ring with the Lord."

Catechism References (CCC):

- CCC 1431 "Interior repentance is a radical reorientation of our whole life, a return, a conversion to God with all our heart."
- CCC 2043 "The faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on days of obligation and to prepare for it by the reception of the sacrament of reconciliation."
- **CCC 1387** "To prepare for worthy reception of this sacrament, the faithful should observe the fast required in their Church."
- CCC 2447 "Almsgiving is a witness to fraternal charity and a work of justice pleasing to God."

Practical Applications:

- **Be more intentional at Mass** Engage in the prayers, reflect on your sins during the Penitential Rite, and make an offering of your struggles and good works during the offertory.
- **Examine your conscience daily** Use the PALEGAS method (Pride, Avarice, Lust, Envy, Gluttony, Anger, Sloth) to recognize areas for repentance.
- **Practice fasting** Observe the Eucharistic fast before receiving Communion and consider other small sacrifices as acts of devotion.
- **Give generously** Whether financially, through service, or in offering prayers for others, practice generosity as an act of love.

Reflection Questions:

- Do I take time at Mass to truly repent and prepare my heart for God's grace?
- 2. How can I deepen my prayer life during Lent and beyond?
- 3. What sacrifices can I offer to the Lord to help me grow spiritually?
- 4. Am I giving to those in need as an act of love for God and neighbor?
- 5. How can I carry the lessons of Lent into my daily life even after the season ends?

Hebrews 10:24-25 - "And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

Luke 22:19 - "Then he took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, 'This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.'"
