Homily Summary – 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C)

Overview:

This homily explores the balance between doing for God and being with God. Using the story of Martha and Mary, we're reminded that while service is good, the "one thing necessary" is time spent with Jesus. Our actions should overflow from prayer, not replace it. The homily challenges us to reevaluate our priorities and deepen our personal relationship with Christ.

Main Points:

- Doing vs. Being: Like Martha, we can be busy with good things, yet miss the better part sitting with Jesus like Mary.
- Priorities Matter: Jesus invites us to put Him first, not just in words but in how we spend our time and attention.
- Overflow of Prayer: Our service should flow from a prayerful relationship, not replace it.
- Personal Encounters Matter: Like Abraham with the three visitors (Genesis 18), blessings follow when we give our attention and action to God.
- Interior Life First: Cardinal Van Thuan's prison experience teaches us that being with God can be more important than doing for Him.
- Presence Amid Responsibilities: God doesn't ask us to abandon duties, but to invite Him into them.
- Daily Discernment: Ask: Am I just checking off spiritual to-do's, or really encountering Christ?

Key Scripture References (NRSVCE):

- Luke 10:42 "There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her."
- Genesis 18:3,5 "Do not pass by your servant... that you may refresh yourselves."
- Galatians 2:20 "It is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me." (Implied in the call to let Jesus be at the center.)

Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) References:

- CCC 2567 God tirelessly calls each person to the mysterious encounter of prayer.
- CCC 2697 Prayer is a vital necessity. If we do not allow the Spirit to lead us, we fall back into slavery.
- CCC 2708 Meditation engages thought, imagination, emotion, and desire a necessary discipline for Christian life.

Reflection Questions:

- Do I spend more time doing things for God than being with Him?
- What distracts me from making prayer a daily priority?
- How can I make my responsibilities more prayerful and Christ-centered?
- When was the last time I sat quietly in Jesus' presence and listened?
- Have I used the Sacrament of Reconciliation recently to return to the Lord's peace?
