They seemed to miss a point Jesus made early in His ministry: He had no place to lay His head. He had nothing that the world would value as security. He had only His Father. The apostles would come to understand what Jesus was speaking about after His death and resurrection. They would understand what He meant when He said the world would hate them because the world hated Him (In 15:18). Jesus did not expect the apostles to live out this commitment on their own strength. He promised to send them the Spirit;
