### DEAR FELLOW PARISHIONERS;

The readings for the next three Sundays lend themselves to profitable reflection on spiritual growth. Beginning with this

Sunday's second reading—a passage from the great Letter to the Hebrews—we are exhorted to see our faith as a call to participation in a life –long race. We are meant to be "athletes for the Lord."

The time-honoured way of understanding this in our Catholic tradition is to see our spiritual growth in *three stages, three "laps" around the race track, so to speak.* The first lap has been called the *"Purgative" stage.* It is purgative because in this phase God's spirit urges us to take seriously—perhaps for the first time—the negative affects of sin in our lives. The Spirit spurs us on to "lay aside the sin that clings to us so closely."

The second stage of spiritual growth has been called the doesn't want to leave the womb, that it would rather not take the *"Illuminative" stage*. We have entered into a personal relationship with Jesus. We have become intentional disciples. Our minds are illuminated by the knowledge of Jesus as our Lord and Saviour and a womb, a womb preparing us for a birth into a new life. In the third stage the Spirit moves us to unite ourselves with Christ's sufferings in order to share in his resurrection. For this reason this third phase has been called the *"Unitive" phase.* 

This Sunday we are on the first lap. We have looked at the Purgative Stage. Next Sunday, we will run the second lap as we reflect on the Illuminative stage. On the third, and last, Sunday we will consider the Unitive stage, which is the "final sprint."

**More excerpts from Sister Briege McKenna's book, "Miracles Do Happen." Enjoy!** In my own life, while I gave my life to Jesus, there were moments of suffering, moments I had to struggle through temptation, through disappointments, rejection and misunderstanding, great challenges, and inevitable suffering. The most vivid experience of challenge to faith and of bearing my own cross came to me in the death of my father. My father was a strong man, a farmer. He died unexpectedly one winter night as he came home from visiting with friends. As he walked up the steps of his home and started to open the door, he had a stroke. All night he lay there, alone and helpless, unable to call for help, with my brother

and his family just across the street. He was discovered dead the next morning. He had frozen to death. As I thought about my father's death, I wondered how this could have happened. I had stood by the beds of many dying people, comforting them, and helping them prepare to see Jesus. But for my own father to die as he did, alone and without family near him, with my brother's home in full view but no one to comfort him-how could this be? Because of my faith in Jesus, I could look at death as a believer must. It is only an opening of a door. The way he died was tragic, but on the other hand, he could have been lying for years in unbearable pain. The Lord took him through the door of death more quickly than that -and took him as he lived, on his way with his key in his hand. He is now with the Lord and that is far better than anything we can have on earth. From this experience, I realized that death is like being born. When a baby is in the womb, it is safe and secure. If a baby could talk, I am sure it would say it doesn't want to leave the womb, that it would rather not take the chance to see what the world is all about because there is no coming back. With our belief in eternal life, we can see the world as the baby don't want to go through the door of death into that other life. If is an unknown, there is no returning. Even with faith, we hesitate to take the plunge. Yet any person who has gone through the door of death into the arms of Jesus would say they would never come back. With all of that, my faith and this deeper understanding of death, it did not make my sorrow any easier. When I left home to return to the United States to start my mission to Brazil, a wave of sorrow and loneliness hit me, I remember that in Dublin, as I was waiting to leave, Fr. Kevin just sat with me as I cried. I just had to let out the sorrow. I had to be able to express this sorrow. Some people do not understand that sorrow is a natural emotion that must be expressed. Because this good friend could listen and let me cry, I felt the Lord's strength coming to me through him as a friend believer and priest. I was able to offer this suffering to the Lord as my prayer and preparation for my ministry in Brazil. Because I was so empty, because I had to rely on him
