Main Points

- 1. Who we listen to shapes our lives The joke at the beginning illustrates how different perspectives shape our worldview.
- 2. Listening in Scripture The Father's voice in the Gospel commands us: "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to Him" (Luke 9:35, NRSVCE).
- 3. Listening leads to obedience Abram (Genesis 12:1-4) trusted and obeyed God, leading to great blessings.
- 4. **Jesus is the Good Shepherd** He is both *kalos* (morally excellent) and *agathos* (competent in His mission). We are called to be like Him in both aspects, according to our circumstances.
- 5. Lent is a time to listen even better Silence in liturgy, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving all help us hear God's voice more clearly.
- 6. St. Joseph's example He listened and acted immediately on God's will, as we are called to.
- 7. Listening requires action True listening transforms us and our relationships, drawing us closer to God.

- Luke 9:35 "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to Him!"
- Genesis 12:1-4 God calls Abram, and he listens in faith.
- **Psalm 27:1** "The Lord is my light and my salvation."

Catechism References (CCC)

- CCC 144 "To obey (from the Latin *ob-audire*, to 'listen to') in faith is to submit freely to the word that has been heard, because its truth is guaranteed by God, who is Truth itself."
- CCC 2716 "Contemplative prayer is hearing the Word of God. Far from being passive, such attentiveness is the obedience of faith."
- CCC 532 St. Joseph is an example of humble listening and obedience to God.
- CCC 1439 Conversion begins with listening to God and responding to His call.

Practical Applications

- Increase time in prayer Spend silent time with God daily, asking Him to speak to your heart.
- Read Scripture more attentively Treat the Bible as God's direct word to you.
- Examine your Lenten practices Ensure fasting, prayer, and almsgiving help you hear God's voice better.
- Go to Confession regularly Listening to God also means receiving His mercy and guidance.
- Follow St. Joseph's example Listen to God's promptings and act on them without delay.

Reflection Questions

- 1. Who am I listening to most in my daily life? Does it bring me closer to God?
- 2. How can I improve my ability to listen to God during this Lent?
- 3. Do I treat prayer as a conversation where I truly listen, or just as a time to speak to God?
- 4. What changes in my life show that I have truly been listening to Jesus?
- 5. Do I act on what I hear from God, or do I hesitate and delay obedience?
