### **Homily Summary – Trinity Sunday (2025)**

### **Main Points**

### 1. Miracle of the Loaves Points to the Eucharist

- Jesus takes, blesses, breaks, and gives the bread (cf. Matthew 14:13–21), which foreshadows the Last Supper and the Mass.
- o The multiplication was not just to feed hunger but to reveal His identity and His gift of self.

### 2. The Eucharist is the Real Presence of Christ

- o The Eucharist is not a symbol—it is Jesus Himself: Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.
- St. Cyril of Jerusalem affirmed: "Since Christ Himself has said, 'This is My Body,' who shall dare to doubt?"

### 3. The Eucharist is the Memorial of the Passion

- o St. Thomas Aquinas teaches it is the perfect sacrament of the Lord's Passion.
- St. Paul says: "As often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes" (1 Corinthians 11:26).

### 4. The Eucharist Transforms Us

- o We become what we receive. St. Augustine: "We become what we receive."
- o The Eucharist makes us the Body of Christ to the world.

### 5. Reverence and Sacredness Matter

- Fragments of the Eucharist are collected with care. Sacred linens are treated with deep reverence.
- Every piece of the Eucharist is Christ, and no part is to be lost.
