### Homily Summary – 32<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

Theme: Purity of Intention and Authentic Love

#### **Main Points**:

### 1. The Story of the Job Application Mistake

- o Illustrates the desire to make a good impression and appear presentable to others.
- o Similar to how we often want to present ourselves well, sometimes we get caught up in the appearance of our actions rather than the true motivation behind them.

#### 2. The Example of the Widow's Offering

- The widow in the Gospel (Mark 12:41-44) gives her last coins, unnoticed by others but fully noticed and praised by Jesus. Her self-giving demonstrates true devotion, purity of heart, and total trust in God.
- o Jesus contrasts her sincerity with the scribes, who focus on outward appearances rather than genuine devotion, urging us to evaluate our own motivations.

### 3. The Call to Purity of Intention

- Reflect on whether our actions are driven by love for God and neighbor or by the desire for recognition.
- Jesus wants us to give ourselves wholly to God with sincere love, which brings inner peace and joy beyond human praise.

## 4. The Connection to Remembrance Day

Reminds us of soldiers' sacrifices, often done with noble intentions for the good of others, even
if not always perfectly pure. This example of self-giving love inspires us to purify our intentions
and seek to act out of genuine love and service.

#### 5. Mary as Our Model of Pure Intention

o Mary's "yes" to God (Luke 1:38) shows a life given in pure devotion, inspiring us to live authentically and selflessly.

### **Reflection Questions:**

- 1. Am I always acting out of love for God and others, or do I sometimes seek human approval?
- 2. Do I notice the small moments where my intentions may not be fully pure?
- 3. How can I practice greater sincerity in my actions and choices?

#### Catechism References:

- CCC 2465: The call to live in truth and sincerity.
- CCC 1752: The importance of intention in the morality of our actions.
- CCC 2539: Challenges us to avoid envy and seek purity of heart.
- CCC 2218: Emphasizes respect and love as the motivation behind our actions.

#### **Main Bible Verses:**

- Mark 12:41-44: The widow's offering and Jesus' praise for her sincere giving.
- Matthew 6:1: Warning against doing good for show.
- Matthew 5:16: "Let your light shine before others."
- Luke 1:38: Mary's response of complete devotion, "Let it be done unto me according to your word."

**Takeaway**: Let's strive to live with purity of intention, seeking God's glory rather than human praise. By examining our motives and acting out of true love, we can experience a joy and peace that only comes from God. May we, inspired by the widow, the soldiers we remember, and Mary, ask the Holy Spirit to purify our intentions, allowing us to be a bright witness of God's love to the world.
