Feast of the Presentation - 2025

Overview:

The Feast of the Presentation, also known as Candlemas, celebrates Jesus being presented in the Temple and recognized by St. Simeon as "a light for revelation to the Gentiles." This feast has long been associated with the blessing of candles, symbolizing Christ as the light of the world. We are called to receive His light and reflect it to others.

Main Points:

- Jesus is the Light of the World As St. Simeon proclaims in today's Gospel, Christ came to bring salvation to all people.
- **Symbolism of Candles** The wax represents Christ's body, the wick His soul, and the flame His divinity. Candles give light by being consumed, just as we are called to self-giving love.
- Mary's Example Like the moon reflects the sun's light, Mary reflects Christ's light, and we are called to do the same.
- Living as the Light of Christ Through prayer, the Eucharist, and acts of love, we allow Christ's light to shine through us.

Bible References (NRSVCE):

- Luke 2:22-32 Jesus is presented in the Temple; St. Simeon calls Him "a light for revelation to the Gentiles."
- John 8:12 "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life."
- Matthew 5:14-16 "You are the light of the world... let your light shine before others."

Action Items:

- 1. Use Blessed Candles in Prayer Light a blessed candle during prayer at home as a reminder of Christ's presence.
- 2. Spend Time with Jesus in the Eucharist Receive His light through Mass and Adoration.
- 3. Be a Light to Others Show Christ's love through acts of charity and kindness.
- 4. **Reflect on Your Own Presentation to God** Offer yourself anew to the Lord, asking Him to shine through you.

Rhyme Summary:

Christ is the light, so shining and bright, Guiding our hearts through the darkest of night. St. Simeon saw Him, the child so true, A bright burning flame of love for me and you.

Like candles, *we* burn with our love to give, By Christ's own light, we're called to live. Reflecting His glow in all that we do, So others can see Christ's radiance too.
