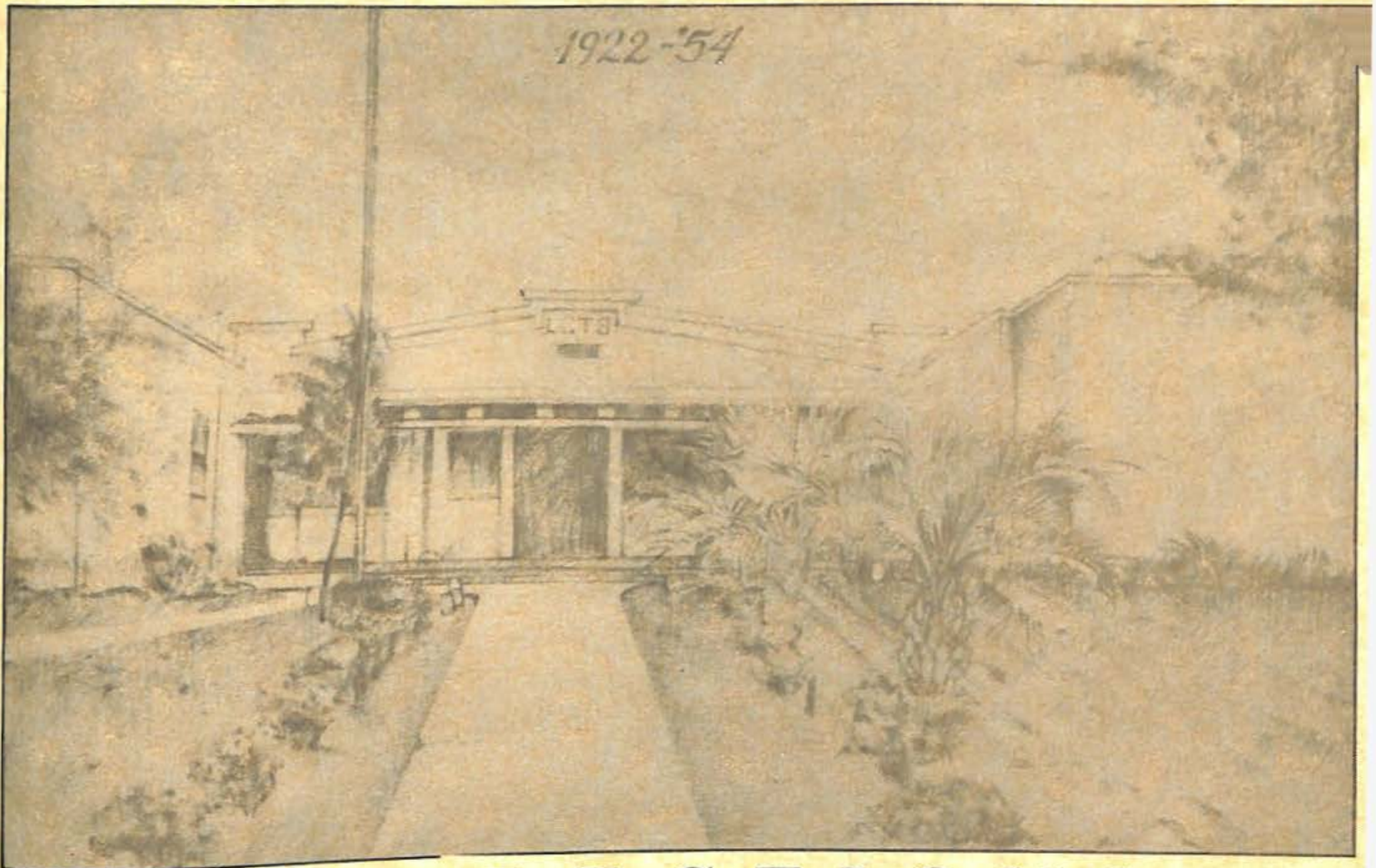
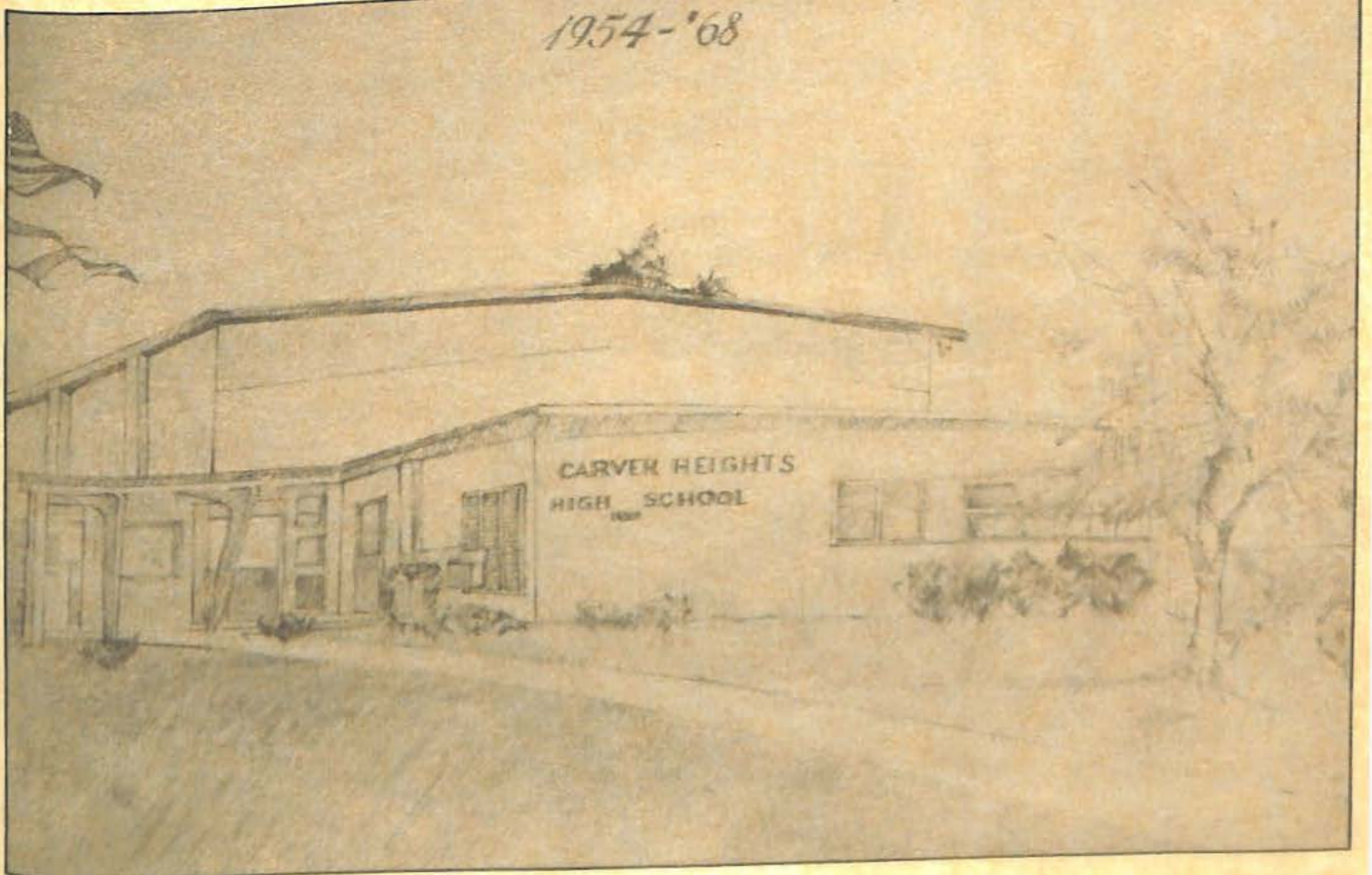

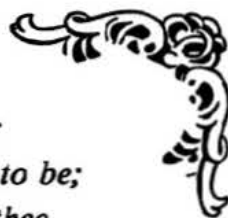
IN MEMORIAM

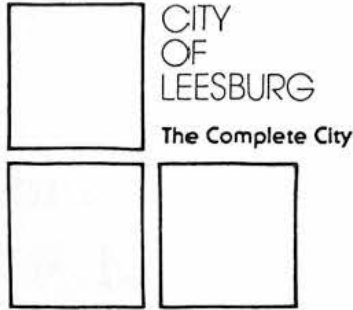

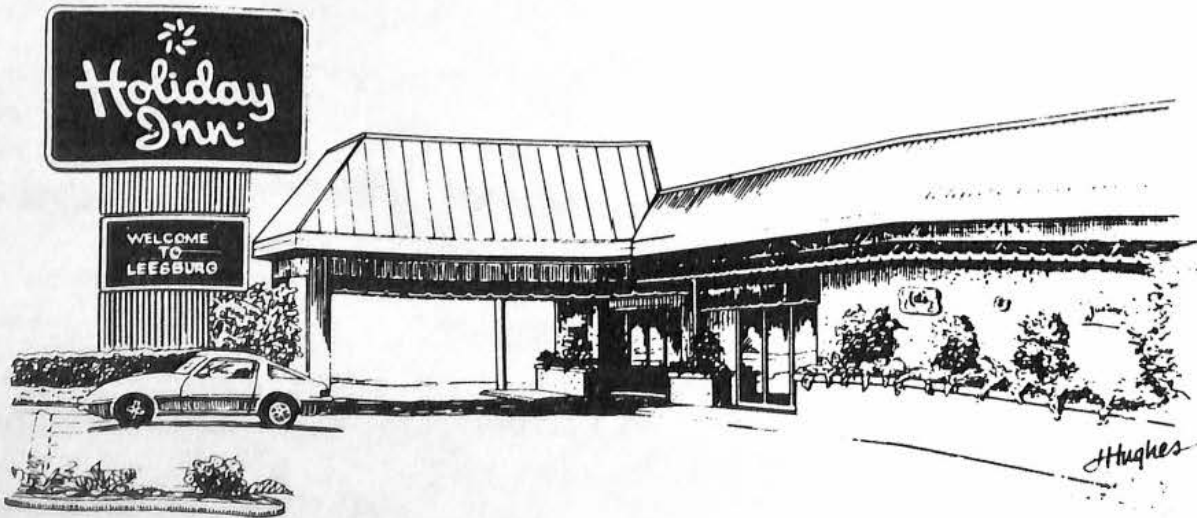



HISTORY

The first school for Negro youth of Leesburg was begun in 1876 in a building on the site of what is now St. Stephen A.M.E. Church under the administration of Reverend S. A. Williams.

It was the year 1882 when the late Professor John Morgan Dabney became principal and served in a building on the site of the present Mt. Olive Progressive Baptist Church on Childs Street. At that time the school term was three months long with grades one through eight.

After this building was destroyed by fire, the school was relocated in a two-story building on Mike Street. This building was also destroyed by fire. Pupils and teachers took refuge in a building owned by Mrs. Prudence Mobley on east Main Street, then known as New Town.

This constant moving from place to place continued until a group of concerned citizens felt there was an urgent need for a permanent school building. Under the leadership of Mrs. Catherine Minatee, they consulted the school board, and five acres of land were purchased on Washington Street by the County on March 10, 1921. In 1922 the new structure was built and given the name, Lake County Training School.

Superintendent D. H. Moore appointed Henry McCrary principal of this new school. The enrollment was less than 100, and the faculty consisted of five members.

F. A. Williams succeeded Henry McCrary as principal of Lake County Training School, but his term was short-lived.

I knew that it would be difficult to leave familiar surroundings and a familiar way of life, but our mother told us that it was a must that we move to Florida.

Cleveland, Ohio was our home. It was the only home that I had ever known. Our family physician advised our mother that for the sake of our older brother's (known in Leesburg as Bishop Graham) health, we should move to Florida. Our older brother was recuperating from pneumonia and the cold climate surely was not beneficial to his recovery.

Mother and daddy knew that it was a wise decision and off we started. I still remember the packing and the "good-byes" to friends. My mother had asked our physician, "How long do I have?" That was a strange question to pose, I thought, but as time passed, I understood the logic of it. The doctor's reply was, "time's-a-wastin'."

We came to Florida, but our planned destination was interrupted. We settled in Zuba, Florida until our mother presented us with a new baby brother. What a happy surprise!

When our mother was able to travel again, we continued our trek to Leesburg, Florida. It was here that my father, Mr. Porter Henry Graham, a carpenter, began work on what would be Lake County Training School. He continued here on the job until the school was completed.

I was there on the first day! I remember most vividly the new desks so beautiful! I remember my teacher, Mrs. Susie Mitchell (Pawley), whom I loved dearly. And I still recall the view of the school on Washington Street from our home on East Magnolia Street. Then, we could see the school from our porch. What a vast change!

We, (we had made friends with the Roundtree children) could walk to school in a very brief time. I would enter the door and turn left to go to my classroom...and on to chapel (assembly) everyday. There was chapel *every* morning: Bible scripture, songs, and rules and regulations for the day. Then, we were back to the classrooms for PURE BASICS.

A move to greener pastures - father's new job — goodbyes to Leesburg for *then*...as is evident, I returned.

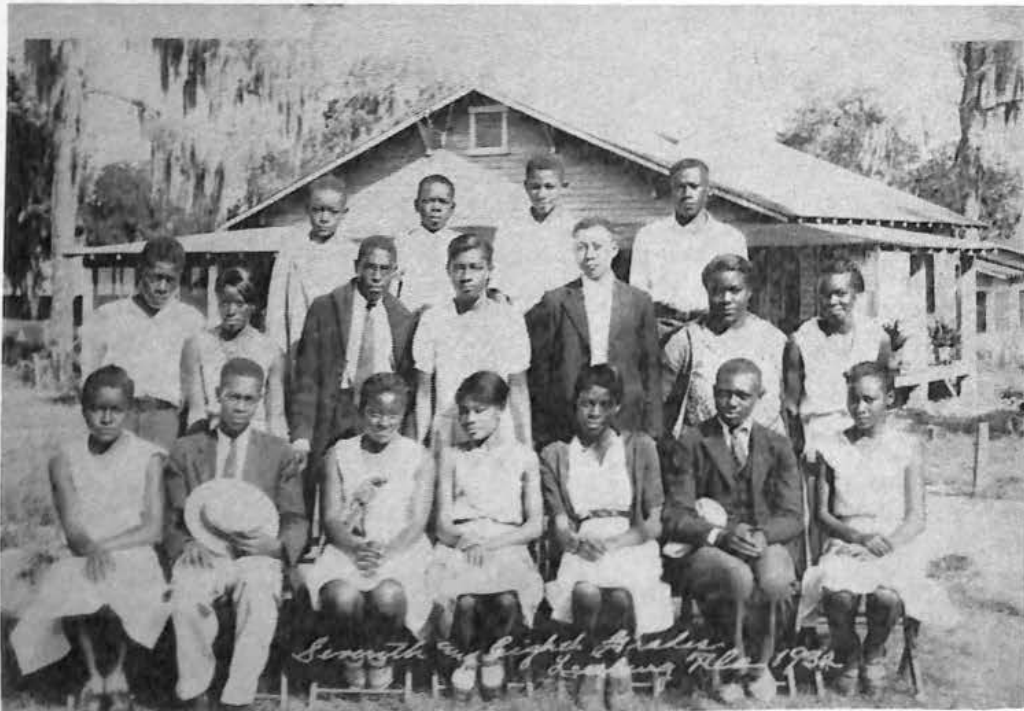

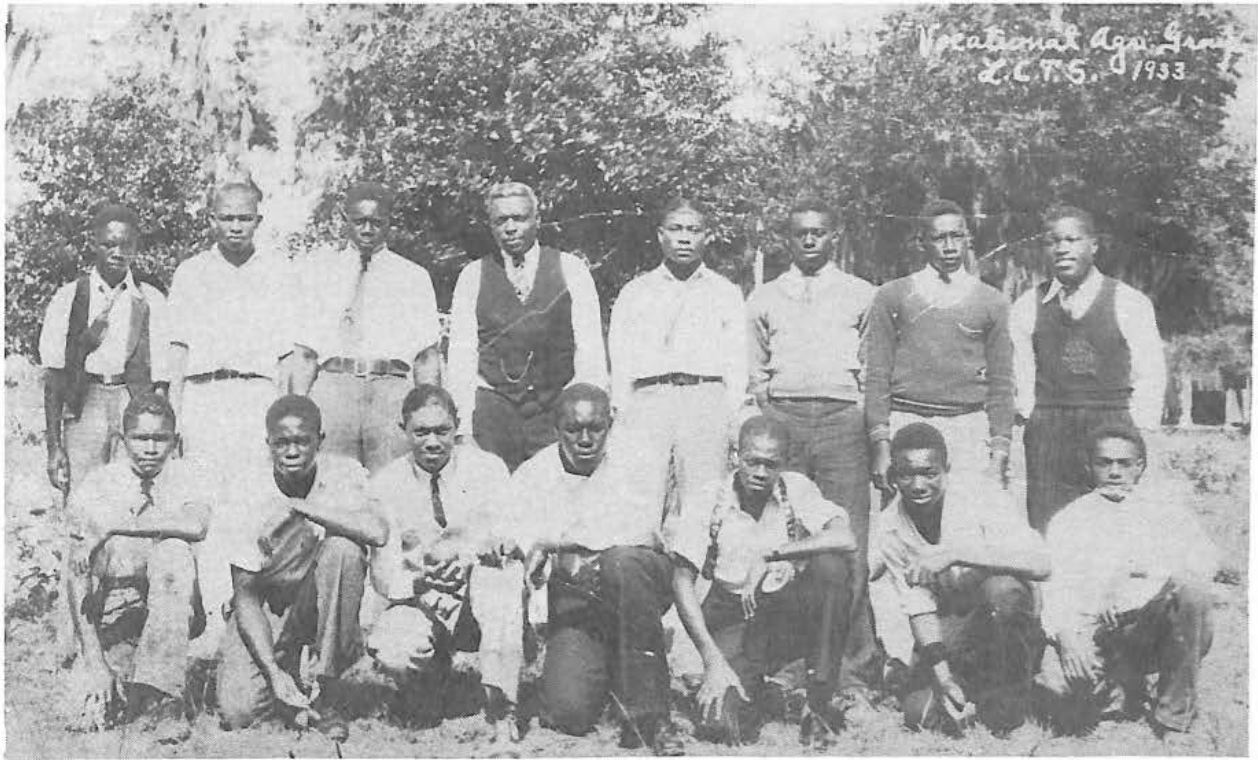

In May, 1933, he had the first twelfth grade graduating class. The enrollment had increased to 300 students. F. J. Banning was the Superintendent at this time.

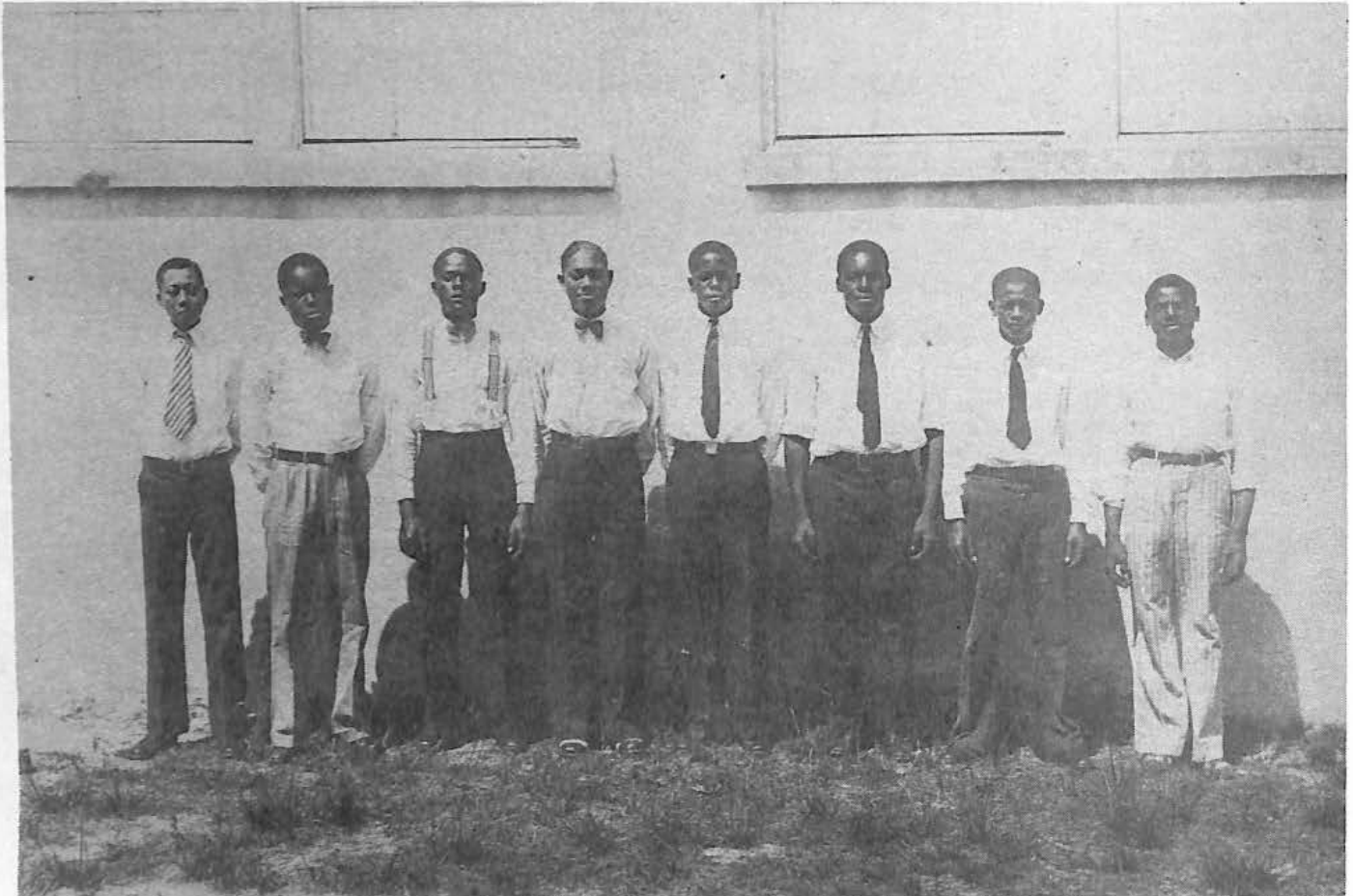

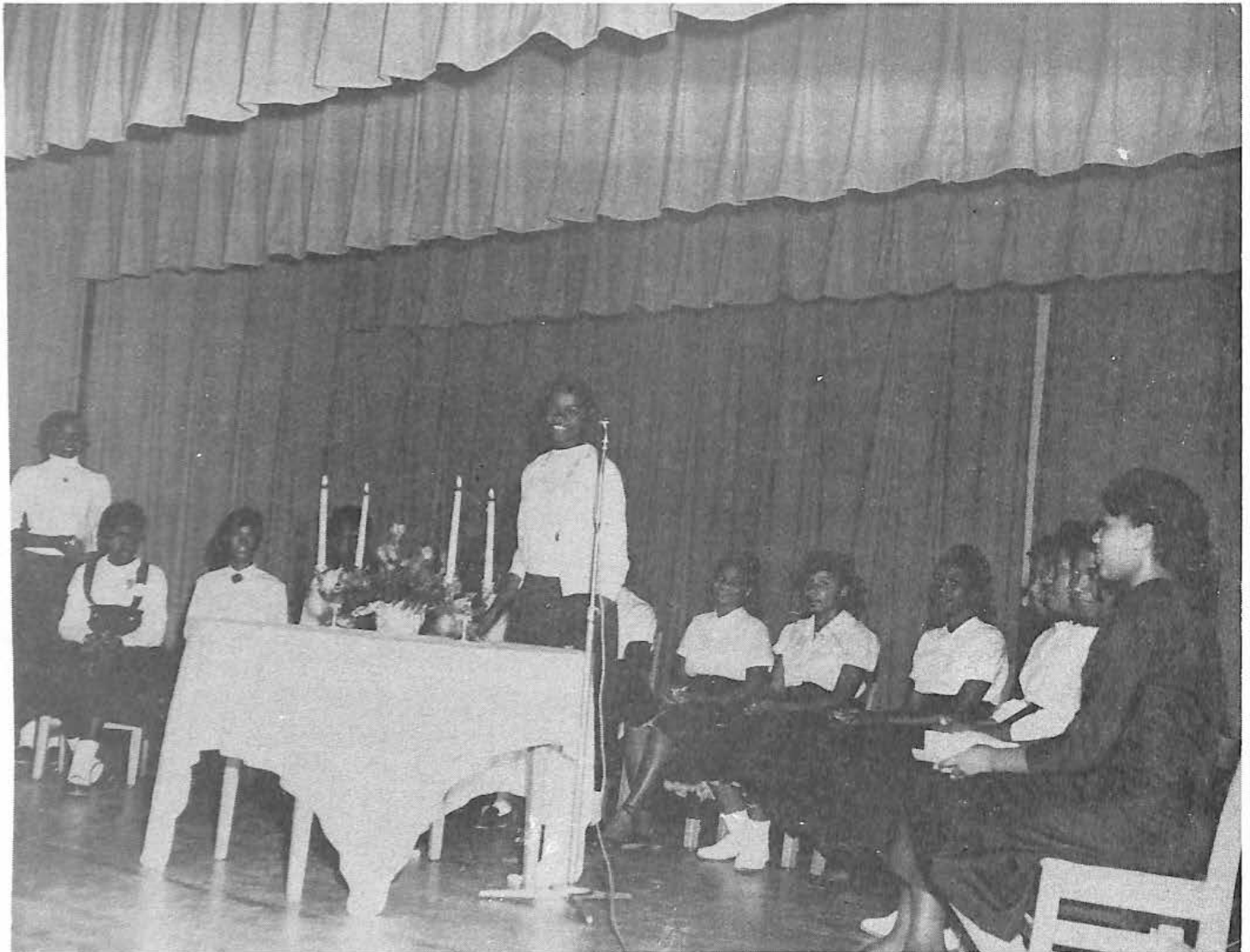
