EMERGING THREAT ENVIRONMENT: Despite historically low antisemitism, Portugal has experienced a significant deterioration since October 2023. Political silence on antisemitic incidents, synagogue vandalism, and organized protests targeting Jews represent a concerning trajectory for a small but growing Jewish community.
