Sequence of Teaching and Learning

Notes

Not to be seen as a lesson by lesson guide – should be ongoing learning.

Food/restaurant vocabulary and skills to run throughout the year alongside role play in these areas in English.

1	LO: Greetings	Basic greetings. Introduce basic greetings (bonjour, au revoir). Children practice saying the greetings. Children role play meeting people and using the greetings.
2	LO: Greetings	Recap greetings. Teach the 'two little dickie birds' song (google drive). Use what we have learnt to identify words we know. Teach meaning of the song. Teach children to sing the song and do the actions.
3	LO: Numbers 1-5	Teach the sequence of numbers 1-5. Use song from 'The Lingo Show'. Practice counting various objects/images in French. Count the objects one at a time then ask how many altogether (reinforces counting/maths skills)
4	L.O: Restaurant vocabulary	Begin to introduce French vocabulary alongside English in role play areas. There is no expectation for words to be displayed visually – focus on exposure to the language orally.
