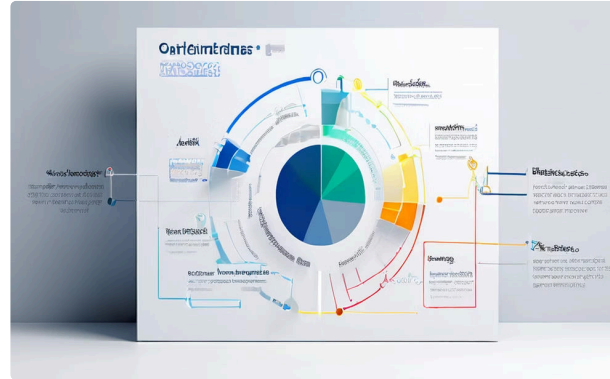

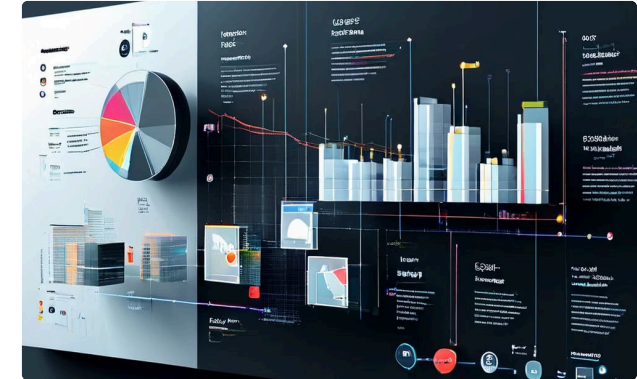
Visualizing Processes
