


#### ACCESSIBILITY



First Year Florida is a course designed to aid students in a successful transition to the University of Florida. This course aims to help students develop the practical, social, emotional, and intellectual skills that are essential to a fulfilling four years at UF, provide a foundation for a well-rounded college experience, connect students to the University of Florida, promote engagement within and outside the classroom, and communicate university expectations.



#### Semester Goals


After careful reflection, create a list of at least five distinct goals which you hope to achieve at some point during your college experience. These goals may be academic, social, or personal in nature. Include a brief description about how each goal can contribute to your success as a first-year student at UF. Length Requirement: 300 words

#### One-on-One Meeting and Reflection

Due 9/25 at 11:59 pm

In order to facilitate a more personalized experience, Katie and Krista will be conducting one-on-one meetings with each student throughout the beginning of the semester. Sign-ups will take place during the first and second weeks of the course, after which Katie and/Krista will reach out to develop more concrete plans with each student. The purpose of this assignment is to learn more about you and your personal experiences, and how we can help you navigate through your first semester. After the one-on-one, you are expected to turn in a brief reflection describing your feelings before and after the meeting and any questions/concerns that may have been addressed/alleviated during the conference.

#### Service Project

#### Resume & Headshot

Due 9/25 at 11:59 pm

Having a professional resume and headshot is imperative when applying for jobs and other leadership opportunities at UF and beyond. The Career Connections Center, located in the Reitz Union (Suite 1300), offers free services to help students develop professionally. For this assignment, create a resume if you do not already have one, and then visit the Career Connections Center for critiques.

The Express Drop-In service is available from 11:00 am – 4:00 pm on weekdays. You are expected to bring a hard copy of their current resume to the CCC meeting and should submit both the original copy and any notes/revisions from the CCC appointment to Canvas. In addition, you must visit the Gator Career Closet (on the ground floor of the Career Connections Center) to have a professional headshot taken. This headshot should be uploaded to Canvas as well.

#### **Meeting with Professor**

Due 10/2 at 11:59 pm

Meet with one UF professor of your choice for a one-on-one meeting. Professors often have their office hours listed on the class syllabus for such purposes. Taking advantage of office hours can open doors to many opportunities, such as future academic research positions, letters of recommendations, and helpful professional mentoring. The purpose of this meeting is to give you the chance to broaden your network and seek information from an experienced professional.

Prior to the meeting, compose a list questions/discussion topics. Submit this list in Canvas, along with a brief reflection about your meeting.

Length Requirement: 150 words, not including list of questions/discussion topics

#### Mid-Semester Reflection

Due 10/9 at 11:59 pm

We want to know how your first semester – including this course – is going. Write a short reflection to discuss academics (classes, professors, workload), engagement (are you getting involved or plan to get involved), and this course (what else can we do to assist you). You can submit this as a written paper (300 words) or another creative format (infographic, Powtoon, Prezi, video, etc.).

Length Requirement: 300 words (if paper); see rubric for creative formats

#### StrengthsQuest Assessment

Due 10/9 at 11:59 pm

You will take the StrengthsQuest assessment and bring your results to class. Strengths Quest is a personality test designed to help students identify their top 5 strengths. By capitalizing on these strengths, students will learn what they are naturally good at and how to use these strengths to succeed personally and professionally. (The assessment is not academic – there are not right or wrong answers, and results will be different for each student.)

#### **Advising Appointment**

Due 10/23 at 11:59 pm

Meeting regularly with your academic advisor is a key component to success. Advising offices tend to get very busy prior to course scheduling (at the end of each semester) so it is important to plan in advance. Appointments can be

made online or over the phone, depending on the college with which you are affiliated. Walk-in hours are typically available as well, but often result in longer wait times. For this assignment, you are required to meet with an academic advisor within you college. Prior to the appointment, you should compose a list of questions/discussion topics. Submit the list of questions in Canvas, along with a picture of the business card of the advisor with whom you met, and a brief reflection about what you discussed and learned.

Length Requirement: 150 words, not including list of questions/discussion topics

#### **Gator CareerLink**


