POT & PLUG TRAY ORDER INFO:

1. **DP50 plug trays** have (50) 2" sq. x 5" deep cells. If inventory permits, partial trays of (2) species at (25) cells each are OK.
2. **DP72 plug trays** have (72) 1.5" sq. x 3" deep cells; no partial trays, full trays only.
3. **P18 deep pots** measure 3" sq. x 5" deep. P18s can be purchased individually or in a tray of (18) for a discounted price. Refer to order form for pricing.
4. **TREEPOTS** are 4" sq. x 14" deep tube style pots.
