The Parish at 6453 N Oracle Rd. is a foodie destination in Tucson's dining scene — **Chef Travis Peters** and the team are pros at combining the charm of Southern comfort bites with Southwest flavors.

They've been around for more than a decade now, too! You're in for a treat if you've never eaten at The Parish, or even if it's been a while since you've stopped by. Jambalaya, shrimp and grits, Southern fried chicken, hushpuppies, po'boy sandwiches, and more.



Also, once a year, the team hosts a big Mardi Gras bash — roasting **an entire alligator** over an open fire paired with a crawfish boil, Cajun sampler plates, and King Cake.
