



In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said,

Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. 



The Caregiver/ Grief Support Group will break for the holidays and resume meeting on Wednesday, January 7th at 3 PM.


Interest Meeting for Anyone Interested in Youth Mentorship
