Remote Curriculum Provision January 2021

The aims of our remote education provision are to:

- 1. Allow all students to access high-quality education and continue their learning across the breadth of our curriculum.
- 2. Follow, where possible, the pattern of the school day.
- 3. Sequence work so that it follows in an established order to ensure effective learning.
- 4. Differentiate tasks to enable all to achieve their full potential.

Remote education provision:

This information is intended to provide clarity and transparency to students and parents or carers about what to expect from remote education where national or local restrictions require entire cohorts (or bubbles) to remain at home.

The remote curriculum:

What is taught to students at home, what should my child expect from remote education? Students are invited to live lessons on Zoom. A link will be sent to you from the Family Liaison officer.

Attendance registers are taken at the beginning and end of lessons.

Lesson Times:

9.30 - 10.30	Zoom call
10.30 - 11.00	Break
11.00 - 12.30	Set work to complete at home
12.30 - 1.00	Lunch
1.00 - 1.30	Zoom call
1.30 – 2.30	Set work to complete at home

Remote teaching and study time each day



















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How long can I expect work set by the school to take my child each day? We expect that remote education (including remote teaching and independent work) will take students broadly the following number of hours each day:

Key Stage 3/4 - 5 hours per day.

Key Stage 5 - 4 hours per day.

To support our students who do not have digital or online access at home, a home pack will be sent home every week to support their learning. Registers are taken at the beginning and end of lessons. Usual absence procedures are in place. Should your child be ill, parents are asked to notify school as normal. We operate a robust system of live monitoring work submission.

- Teachers follow up on submission work by making contact with the student, and, where necessary, by contacting parents / carers.
- How will you check whether my child is engaging with their work and how will I be informed if there are concerns? A register is taken at the beginning and end of every lesson.
- How will you assess my child's work and progress? Students continue to receive a range of feedback and marking, including individual feedback.
- If my child is not in school because they are self-isolating, how will their remote education differ from the approaches described above? This will ne differ as they will be sent a home learning pack home and the link to the Zoom lessons.

During a period of lockdown, all students follow the same remote education. Once all students return on-site, the school will continue to provide remote provision for those who are self-isolating, including digital resources, Blended learning curriculum.
