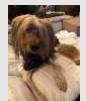

A recent special case...

Spirit - 13 year old

Spirit has been attending weekly hydrotherapy for a few months now due to arthritis affecting all four limbs and in most joints. A few weeks ago though she had a gastric torsion and underwent immediate surgery. This week (3 weeks post-op), with veterinary consent, Spirit was back in the pool to start building back some of the muscle she lost whilst on cage rest. Spirit's sessions currently consist mainly of pod work to keep her mobile and stave off stiffness. In total she is doing less than a minute of swimming which will gradually be increased over the course of the weeks to come. Hydrotherapy has become an important aspect in giving Spirit a good quality of life. Where it may be unusual for a dog to return to the pool so soon after such surgery in this instance between the vet, owner and ourselves it was decided the sooner Spirit return to her sessions the better. Spirit also seemed happy to be back in the water and following her session had a boost of energy which we find occurs with a lot of our senior patients.
