Zonta Rose Day / International Women's Day March 8, 2022



The following is a reprint from a former newsletter. It serves as a reminder of why we celebrate Zonta Rose Day

International Women's Day is a celebration of women's rights and international peace. Its history stretches back to the early 1900s, when women's organizations used the day to rally for their causes from the universal suffrage movement to the protest of poor working conditions. In 1975, during International Women's Year, the United Nations (UN) began celebrating International Women's Day on March 8th. Two years later, in December 1977, the General Assembly adopted a resolution proclaiming a United Nations Day for Women's Rights and International Peace to be observed on any day of the year by Member States, in accordance with their historical and national traditions. In adopting its resolution, the General Assembly recognized the role of women in peace efforts and development, and urged an end to discrimination and an increase in support for women's full and equal participation.

Over the years, the UN and its technical agencies have promoted the participation of women as equal partners with men in achieving sustainable development, peace, security, and full respect for human rights. The empowerment of women continues to be a central feature of the UN's efforts to address social, economic and political challenges across the globe.

Zonta shares the UN's goals for the empowerment of women. Our efforts have made, and continue to make, a difference in the lives of women everywhere.
