Mrs. Audrey is presently the oldest Salem Church member. She has been a member for 71 years and has served the church in a great capacity and in many areas from secretary to teaching positions. In the early days of the church when money for the pastor was scarce, it was up to Mrs. Audrey to take up a collection of canned goods, milk, butter and anything else that the congregation could give to supplement the pastor. At that time, she was the only lady that could drive that had a car. One of the ladies that Mrs. Audrey would visit always gave 2 dozen jars of canned fruit for the pastor. Mrs. Audrey said that times were hard but people were close and gave of what they had.

Bro. Lucius Clements was the architect and head carpenter for Salem Baptist Church that was built in 1953. His brother, J. Hawkins Clements along with the community labored to construct the beautiful church. Bro. J.L. Clements also built churches at Berry, Bankston, and Camp Ground and possible other sites. Bro Wilton Hood stated that there was no building fund when they began construction on Salem Church and that the note was paid in full in 2 years.
