Letter from the Executive Director

As we reflect on 2025, there is no strategic explanation, no fundraising formula, and no internal credit we can point to that fully explains what unfolded this year.

The only honest explanation is God's provision.

In 2025, Iron City Trykes provided 167 therapeutic trykes to children and adults with adaptive needs—the most in a single year in our history. While that number is significant, it is not what defines this year. What defines 2025 is that every single need was met. Every approved application was fulfilled. Every obstacle was met with provision. Every moment of uncertainty was met with reassurance.

Our mission has never been about growing numbers for the sake of growth. It has always been about faithfulness—responding to need as it comes and trusting that provision will follow. This year tested that trust in ways we could not have anticipated.

One of the clearest examples came this summer as we transitioned to a newly updated version of the AmTryke®. It quickly became evident that the new model did not serve our recipients as well as the tried-and-true design we had relied on for years. Faced with the question of how best to serve the individuals counting on us, we explored whether it was still possible to obtain the previous model.

The answer was yes—but only if we placed a substantial order.

That order totaled 150 trykes at a cost of \$143,000.

After much prayer and discussion, we placed the order. Then we looked at one another with a mix of faith and fear, quietly wondering, What have we done?

Just two days later, Greg was having lunch with one of our faithful monthly donors. This donor had no knowledge of the order, no awareness of the financial leap we had just taken. During that conversation, the donor simply said, “I want to match up to \$50,000 in donations between now and the end of the year.”

In that moment, God showed up unmistakably.

That single act of generosity resulted in \$100,000 toward the very order we had stepped out in faith to place. It was not coincidence. It was confirmation. A reminder that when the mission remains the priority, provision follows in ways only God can orchestrate.

Stories like this unfolded again and again throughout 2025. Time after time, needs were met—not because we planned perfectly, but because we trusted faithfully.

As we look ahead to 2026, our focus remains unchanged. We will not chase growth. We will not measure success by year-over-year increases. Instead, we will continue to fulfill every approved application placed before us, trusting God, stewarding resources wisely, and serving individuals with dignity and care.

Thank you for being part of this journey. Your generosity, prayers, and support are tools God uses to keep the wheels turning—and lives moving forward.



What remains constant is our promise to respond to every approved application with compassion, dignity, and care.

In 2025, that commitment resulted in a record number of trykes—but more importantly, it resulted in every need being met.

Miracle Hope

Strength Beyond Circumstance

A few years ago, Miracle Hope's life changed in an instant. After a serious car accident, Miracle was left paralyzed, lost one of her legs, and now relies on a respirator 24 hours a day. Her world narrowed dramatically—mobility, independence, and even simple childhood moments suddenly felt far away.

But Miracle's spirit never wavered.

When Miracle received her adaptive tryke from Iron City Trykes, it represented something far bigger than movement. It was a reminder that her story was still unfolding. Carefully fitted and thoughtfully adapted to meet her complex medical needs, her tryke gave Miracle a way to experience motion, joy, and freedom again.

Watching Miracle ride—supported, smiling, and fully present—was a powerful reminder that impact isn't measured only in miles pedaled, but in dignity restored and hope renewed. Miracle's courage inspires everyone who meets her, and her name reflects exactly what she is: a miracle filled with hope.



Asir ***Born to Race***

Asir doesn't see limitations—he sees competition.

Living with arthrogryposis, Asir has no flexion in one leg, only about 80% flexion in the other, and limited use of his arms. Movement has never come easily. But determination? That comes naturally.

From the moment Asir climbed onto his adaptive trike, his personality took over. He wasn't cautious. He wasn't hesitant. He was focused on one thing: racing everyone in sight.

Each pedal stroke was powered by grit and joy. His trike gave him more than mobility—it gave him a lane to compete, to belong, and to be exactly who he is. Asir reminds us that ability isn't defined by range of motion, but by heart. And his heart is unstoppable.



Everett

Learning to Look Up

Everett has SpinaBifida and no use of his legs, but that has never stopped him from trying to move forward.

On his hand-powered tryke, Everett kept running into the wall—again and again.

His mom gently stopped him and said,

“Everett, you have to look up to see where you are going.”

He paused, then responded with words that no one in the room will ever forget:

“But Mom, I’ve never seen my legs move.”

That moment captured everything Iron City Trykes stands for.

Everett’s world has been shaped by adaptation, learning, and resilience. His tryke isn’t just teaching him how to ride—it’s helping him discover new ways to navigate a world that wasn’t built with him in mind.

Today, Everett keeps riding. He keeps learning. And he keeps reminding us that perspective changes everything.

These stories are why we do what we do—because every child deserves movement, dignity, and the chance to see what’s possible.

Programs & Community Reach

Iron City Trykes exists to remove barriers to mobility by responding to individual need with care, precision, and dignity. Providing a therapeutic tryke is never a one-size-fits-all process—it requires collaboration, expertise, and community.

Throughout 2025, Iron City Trykes hosted multiple tryke fittings where recipients were carefully matched with the correct AmTryke® model. Licensed physical therapists volunteered their time to ensure every tryke was properly fitted, adjusted, and safe, allowing each rider to experience confidence and independence from the very first ride.

Our work extends beyond fittings. Community events and partnerships play a vital role in both awareness and connection. Events such as community rides and seasonal gatherings create space for families to celebrate milestones, for supporters to see impact firsthand, and for the community to rally around inclusion and mobility.

From children experiencing independence for the first time to adults and veterans regaining freedom of movement, Iron City Trykes remains committed to serving individuals of all ages—meeting them where they are and responding with compassion and care.



Corporate Tryke Builds

In 2025, Iron City Trykes launched Corporate Tryke Builds as a new way to engage businesses directly in the mission. These hands-on volunteer experiences invited corporate teams to come together to assemble therapeutic AmTrykes® for individuals with adaptive needs.

Through these builds, corporate partners were able to move beyond traditional volunteerism and participate in a tangible, meaningful way—working side by side to help create mobility, independence, and joy for future riders. For many participants, it was their first direct exposure to the impact of adaptive mobility and the families Iron City Trykes serves.

The response was overwhelmingly positive. Several corporations participated throughout the year, providing not only volunteer manpower but also increased visibility for the mission within their organizations and networks. In multiple cases, these experiences led to ongoing relationships and additional financial support, further strengthening Iron City Trykes' ability to fulfill applications as needs arise.

Corporate Tryke Builds have proven to be more than a volunteer opportunity—they are a bridge between awareness, engagement, and long-term partnership. As this program continues to grow, it will remain rooted in the same principle that guides all of our work: meaningful involvement that directly supports individuals and families in need.



Stewardship & Trust

Stewardship is a responsibility Iron City Trykes takes seriously. Every dollar entrusted to this organization is handled with intention, transparency, and respect for the mission it supports.

Funds raised in 2025 were used primarily for the purchase of therapeutic AmTryke® adaptive tricycles, as well as the components, fittings, and professional expertise required to ensure each tryke met the specific needs of its rider. By working closely with physical therapists, suppliers, and community partners, Iron City Trykes is able to maximize impact while maintaining quality and safety.

Rather than operating with preset spending targets, Iron City Trykes responds to approved applications as they are received—trusting that provision will align with need. This approach allows the organization to remain flexible, responsible, and mission-focused, ensuring that resources are used where they are needed most.

The consistency of support from donors, sponsors, and partners makes this work possible. Their trust enables Iron City Trykes to say “yes” when a need arises and to do so with confidence and integrity.



Looking Ahead to 2026

As Iron City Trykes looks toward 2026, the focus remains unchanged.

There are no numeric goals for trykes to be provided and no projections tied to growth. Instead, the organization remains committed to readiness—prepared to respond faithfully to every approved application placed before it.

Needs will continue to fluctuate. Some years will require more resources, others less. What will not change is the posture of the organization: to listen, to respond, and to trust God for provision along the way.

Iron City Trykes enters 2026 with gratitude for what has been accomplished and confidence rooted not in strategy, but in faithfulness. The path forward is simple—continue meeting needs, stewarding resources wisely, and creating opportunities for mobility, dignity, and joy.
