


St. Alphonsus Parish Update

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (O.C.I.A)

We have this year 4 people who are called to Baptism in our community. But they do not know of any practicing Roman Catholic Christians who can sponsor them. Therefore, we are looking for Sponsors. Here are the requirements:

1. That you are a practicing Roman Catholic
2. That you have time to meet with your candidate (have a coffee or tea together) and get to know each other a little.
3. That you accompany them to the Rite of Election at the Cathedral Sunday, February 22, at 3 p.m.
4. That you accompany them at 3 different blessings (after the homily) at the 11 a.m. Mass at St. Alphonsus (3 different Masses) prior to Holy Week.
5. That you accompany them at the Easter Vigil, Saturday evening, Saturday April 5 (9-11 p.m.).
6. That you “check in” with them after baptism... a few weeks later... a few months later to see how they are doing... and let Fr. Greg know how they are doing... if they need any help, etc.

Help the Needy Week

Lent is coming soon (February 18) and parishioner, Steve Gadient, has suggested a type of activity that has been successful in other churches. This activity would be setting aside one week during Lent in which we as a parish would focus on helping people who have needs in the area of food and clothing. By focusing on this one week, we do not suggest that only one week a year is necessary. Rather, this “Help the Needy Week” will serve to remind us that we can be helping all year long.

There will be 3 basic activities:

1. **A food drive** in which we donate the proceeds to Manitoba Harvest. We already do this... but during this week we encourage you to give even more than usual.
2. **A clothing drive.** Donate gently used clothing from all age groups. This clothing would be sorted out and taken to a ministry in our city that helps single young mothers (Villa Rosa); young people in general (Rossbrook House); and adults (Salvation Army or M.C.C. Thrift Shops).
3. **A Poor Person’s Lunch.** We will participate in Deacon Gilles Lenten Retreat in the hall on Saturday, February 21 from 10 a.m. until noon with a conclusion of a simple meal of soup and sandwiches.

Pope Leo XIV Proclaims Franciscan Jubilee Year

Pope Leo XIV has proclaimed a “Special Year of St. Francis” to commemorate the 800th anniversary of the saint’s death. During this time of grace, which will extend until January 2027, the faithful are granted the opportunity to obtain a [plenary indulgence](#).

This Franciscan Jubilee Year, considered a gift for the entire Church and an occasion for authentic spiritual renewal, was inaugurated on Jan. 10 with a [decree](#) issued by the Apostolic Penitentiary of the Holy See. Until Jan. 10 of next year, the faithful can obtain this grace under the usual conditions — sacramental confession, Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the pope — by making a pilgrimage to any Franciscan conventual church or place of worship dedicated to St. Francis anywhere in the world.

Furthermore, the elderly, the sick, and those who, for serious reasons, cannot leave their homes can obtain the plenary indulgence by spiritually joining in the jubilee celebrations and offering their prayers, pains, or sufferings to God. In a world where “the virtual takes over the real, disagreements and social violence are part of everyday life, and peace becomes more insecure and distant every day, this Year of St. Francis spurs all of us, each according to our possibilities, to imitate the poor man of Assisi, to form ourselves as far as possible on the model of Christ,” the decree states. For the Order of Friars Minor, this time is also an opportunity for the faithful to become “models of holiness of life and constant witnesses of peace.”
