Barb Thomas has been experimenting with Saori style weaving. Noce job, Barb!



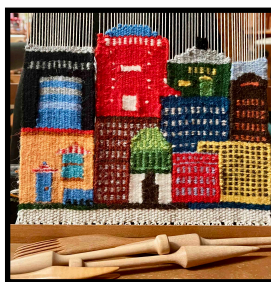
## HOLIDAY CRAFTS
