
Winter Wake-Up Week this year was held from Feb. 4 to the 8.

This was backwards day when clothes could be worn backwards or you could








The Gambler! Wednesday


This was Career Day. Everyone was asked to dress as what they wanted to be when they grew up. That after-noon the school went to the Athens skating arena to skate.
