HERE'S THE SCOOP!!

Members Needed to Volunteer!

What you will be doing when you Volunteer for....

***STEAK NIGHT COORDINATOR** – Provide direction/support to volunteers re: staffing and general functioning of Steak Nights for the season. Track revenue in binder.

STEAK NIGHT PREP TEAMS – 2 people for each week for the season (ideally 4 couples working in 2-week intervals sharing the summer months).

- Order and pick up steaks/chicken/garlic bread
- Prep baked beans and coleslaw, wrap and bake potatoes, marinate chicken prep bowls of condiments.
- Set up food tables and chairs in the hall.
- Liaise with servers.
- Check kitchen/BBQ/ hall ensuring proper clean up
- 5-6 hours/week, (ordering meat, bread on Mondays, pickup of ordered food and prep on Fridays).

FRIDAY STEAK NIGHT SERVERS – 5-6 volunteers for each Friday – can include Members, Cadets & Community Groups (5:30-9 pm)

- Laying out the food table
- Taking pre-paid tickets. Food is paid for at the bar in exchange for steak or chicken meal (2 different colored tickets)
- Serving steaks, chicken, potatoes, beans, garlic bread, coleslaw. Customers cook their own meat, everything else is prepared in kitchen by volunteers.
- Replenishing food supplies from kitchen to serving tables in hall
- Final clean-up of BBQ and kitchen.
- Schedule for volunteers is posted in the Lounge

***BURGER NIGHT COORDINATOR** – Provide direction to Volunteers regarding duties, staffing and general operation of Burger Night. Track revenue in binder for report.

BURGER NIGHT TEAM – 2 - 4 Volunteers for cooking, prep, serving and clean up (3:30 – 7:30 pm)

- Slicing/laying out/replenishing condiments, onions, lettuce, tomatoes, cheese for burgers.
- Making up salad and laying out desserts.
- Keeping an eye on customers to ensure everyone is fed.
- Final clean-up of BBQ and kitchen
- Food is paid for at the bar in exchange for a ticket which is given to cook (in order as customers want their burgers).
