

The Battle of the Atlantic

On the first Sunday of every May, we remember the brave Canadians who ensured transport of vital supplies and troops from North America to Europe during the Second World War. From the war's outbreak until May 8, 1945, Allied troops battled German forces attempting to block the passage of military personnel and supplies between North America and Britain.

Canada's Navy, Merchant Marine and Air Force all played a crucial role in the Battle of the Atlantic. Victory came at a huge cost to the Allies, as more than 36,000 Allied sailors, soldiers and airmen, as well as a nearly equivalent number of merchant seamen, lost their lives in this endeavor. Among those were almost 2,000 members of the Royal Canadian Navy, 1,600 Canadian merchant seamen and 752 Canadian airmen.
