DO YOU KNOW about the annual POPPY CAMPAIGN?

- The Legion is responsible for Canada's Remembrance Poppy Campaign which distributes plastic lapel poppies to be worn in the lead- up to November 11 each year.
- The poppy is worn on the left lapel, as close to the heart as possible.
- The current lapel poppy has been manufactured since 1922- originally sponsored by the Dept. of Soldiers Civil Re-Establishment. Until 1996, the poppy material was manufactured at sheltered workshops operated by Veterans Affairs Canada.
- Typically, poppies are offered up for donation as a symbol of remembrance, using the honor system, with poppies left in open spaces along with a receptacle for leaving a donation toward the campaign.
- Funds raised are mainly used to support ex-service members in need & to fund medical appliances & research, home services, care facilities and numerous other purpose that benefit Veterans.
- Each year, over 21,000,000 Canadians wear poppies and the Poppy Campaign raises over \$17 million for Veterans and their families.
- Volunteers/members can help their Legions each year with publicity, distributing
 poppies at designated businesses within their communities, delivering/picking up
 poppy collection boxes, wearing poppies on their lapel, speaking at local schools,
 and taking orders for wreaths from businesses and households.
- In the Stony Plain Legion, Poppy Funds have recently been used for donations to Stars Air Ambulance, Light -Up Your Life Society, Old Boots Veterans Assoc., Meals on Wheels, "Lest We Forget" Group, Parkland Air Cadets 755, 299 RCSCC MacKenzie Sea Cadets, Stony Plain Seniors Center, Outward Bound Veterans Program, and direct assistance to Veterans among many others.
