sOperation Market Garden was an Allied military operation during the Second World War fought in the German-occupied Netherlands from 17 to 25 September 1944. Its objective was to create a 64 mi (103 km) salient into German territory with a bridgehead over the Nederrijn (Lower Rhine River), creating an Allied invasion route into northern Germany. This was to be achieved by two sub-operations: seizing nine bridges with combined US and British airborne forces ("Market") followed by British land forces swiftly following over the bridges ("Garden").

Canadian Paratroopers of the 1<sup>St</sup> Canadian Parachute Regiment participated in this historic event. They were combined into the British forces. Many of the Canadian Paratroopers who parachuted into Holland were also Veterans of the D-Day into Normandy France in the early morning hours of June 6<sup>th</sup> 1944.

Market would be the largest airborne operation in history, delivering over 34,600 men of the 101st, 82nd and 1st Airborne Divisions and the Polish Brigade. 14,589 troops were landed by <u>glider</u> and 20,011 by parachute. Gliders also brought in 1,736 vehicles and 263 artillery pieces. 3,342 tons of ammunition and other supplies were brought by glider and parachute drop.

Five <u>Victoria Crosses</u> were awarded during Operation Market Garden. Three American soldiers received the <u>Medal of Honor</u>.

### **FYI - FOR VETERANS & THEIR FAMILIES:**

Miscalculation of Disability, Pensions Class Action Settlement, Important Information.

From the office of Michel W. Drapeau,

"My law firm is one of five law firms currently engaged in a Class Action Suit (*Manuge v. His Majesty the King*). I am writing to alert you to the recent settlement that may affect many retired members (and their families) of the Royal Canadian Legion.

I request your assistance in alerting your membership to their potential eligibility make a claim for a settlement payment by publishing a small announcement in the next edition of your newsletter(s).

#### **BACKGROUND**

Between **2003** and **2023**, Veterans Affairs Canada [VAC] miscalculated the pension escalation adjustment for over **330,000** class members, including CAF veterans, members of the RCMP and their dependants. The result is that these clients were underpaid.

On average, claims are worth about \$2,500. However, there are 40 people who are eligible for payments over \$35,000 and approx. 2,000 for payments over \$10,000.

At present, there currently remains tens of millions of dollars in unclaimed funds.

### LIVING CLASS MEMBERS WILL BE PAID AUTOMATICALLY

For living class members, nothing needs to be done. The amount owing will be calculated by VAC and paid directly to the class member.

### **ESTATE OF DECEASED VETERANS NEEDS TO FILE A CLAIM**

However, there are over **215,000 estates** of veterans for whom a claim needs to be made. A claim can be made by a surviving spouse, child, grandchild, parent, sibling, niece/nephew, or next of kin to a class member. Given the relatively slow uptake so far, we have formed the impression that many of these persons are unaware of their entitlement to make a claim.

The entire claims process is being administered by KPMG, who have created a website: <a href="https://veteranspensionsettlement.kpmg.ca/">https://veteranspensionsettlement.kpmg.ca/</a>.

Most importantly, KPMG have created a simple claims process whereby **claims can be submitted electronically** through the website above. A claimant needs only to submit proof of ID, and any other information that may assist the Administrator in verifying their entitlement.

We would greatly appreciate if the information would disseminate the following message to all branch members in the hope of alerting survivors and family members of deceased class members of their entitlements to settlement payments.
