Thousands of dollars are spent to bill, collect, track, and foreclose delinquent property tax – all wasted \$

You **DO NOT** OWN your property, because you must continue to pay to keep it; making you the property of (slaves to) the government



You do not own anything if the government can take it from you. Losing your home because of unpaid property taxes is immoral.



The only right time to pay property tax is the day you buy property!

Annual property tax is a repeated tax on unrealized gains forcing you to ultimately pay the full value of your home to the government.

Property values shouldn't change because the government decides to change them.

Property Tax is the only tax if left unpaid, renders you homeless!

Property Tax Problem!

A. We do not own our homes; the government evicts people every day through tax foreclosure!

B. Mandatory reappraisals occur automatically without voter approval.

C. Property Taxes are based on **speculative and capricious valuations** NOT Market Values.

D. Unfair and deliberate mechanism to **generate revenue without voter approval** or accountability.

Take Action!
