While at the event, a mutual friend excitingly approached us about a dog Bob had for sale. The dog was Farmcliff Donny. He was whelped on 3/24/95 and already had a successful trial carrier which included winning the JRTCC under 12 1/2 racing championship besides numerous local placements for racing and GTG. Besides racing, Genie had started Donny in agility.

A deal was struck and Donny became ours in October 1997. Along with the dog came a friendship with the Franklin's that has continued for 26 years. Bob was always there to answer our questions about racing, GTG, hunting or anything else a newbie might ask. He was always patient to help us understand this complex breed. One of the most stupid questions we sent to Bob was "How was Donny with Cats?" Genie was a wealth of knowledge regarding agility and supported my fibril attempt to run Donny.

Over the years we acquired some great terriers from the Franklin's, notably, Northgate Hayden and Farmcliff Bubba.

Bob and Genie would stay with us when they went to the Tennessee Terrier Olympics and I stayed with them on several occasions.

We will always cherish the kindness and friendship Bob and Genie have bestowed on us over the years and hope it continues on for many years.

The first I learned of Bob Franklin was when I got my very first Jack Russell, Mitzie. We were practicing racing puppies in Pat Comb and Mary Webb's backyard. We were using a fishing pole as a lure. The puppies very quickly could run faster than I could reel in that fishing pole so my husband, Sam, built a lure machine for us to use for racing. Then I needed to figure out how to set up a racetrack. I went online to look up information and found an article written by Bob Franklin with instructions on how to set up a racetrack - everything I needed to know.

I think it was the following year that my husband bought me a lure machine and all of the equipment needed to set up a lure course. Lisa Skjoria and I contacted Susan Travaglini to see if we could run the lure at one of her Breezewood trials. It would be at Susan's trials that I would

actually meet Bob Franklin. Because he had such a reputation, I was a little intimidated by him. However, I soon learned that if I would just listen, he had a lot of very good advice for me.

Years later, when I ended up hospitalized with a broken ankle at a trial in Connecticut, Bob Franklin and the Benoit's went out of their way to help Sam and I get through all that and back home. Later Susan would let me know that Bob had even offered to help me run the lure coursing at Breezewood if I needed it.

Exhibitors and owners of terriers must be current JRTCA members. These trials are sanctioned by the JRTCA.

GENERAL RULES

- 1. All sanctioned classes are open to Jack Russell Terriers only.
- 2. Exhibitors and owners of terriers entered must be current JRTCA members and must not be a member of a conflicting JRT organization or register their JRTs in any all-breed registry or conflicting JRT organization. If an exhibitor is found to be in violation of this policy, entry will be disqualified and no refunds will be given. If a violation is confirmed after the trial, placements will be voided from all JRTCA records. Exhibitors must submit a completed entry form including a signed waiver for every trial they enter.
- 3. Entries must be within the 10-15 inch JRTCA height standard for all sanctioned classes (with the exception of pups who have not yet met the 10 inch height standard); measuring devices will be available on the trial grounds.
- Puppies (under 12 months) are not eligible for championship in any division but their own. Puppies are eligible to compete only if they have reached their four-month birthday (NOT 16 weeks). A puppy's age is the actual age on the day of the trial.
- 5. Bitches in season may not compete in any division. Pre-entry fees of bitches in season will be refunded with a veterinarian certificate or as otherwise agreed upon by the Trial Administrator.
- Spayed or neutered terriers may compete in the Miscellaneous Conformation Section only. They
 may not compete in Puppy, Family*, Open, or Working Conformation. *Note: For Family Classes,
 Brood Bitches and Stud Dogs entered may not be spayed / neutered. The offspring at their sides
 may be intact or spayed/neutered.
- 7. A terrier bred by a sanctioned JRTCA Judge may not be shown under that Judge in the Conformation division.
- 8. Terriers owned or co-owned by the Trial Chairperson or any member of their household may not be entered in any phase of the competition with the exception of Child and Youth Handling.
- 9. Terriers owned by judges may not be entered in the division in which they are judging but may enter the competition in any other division.
- 10. Terriers owned by stewards may be entered in any division provided that they find a substitute to perform their duties or have someone else show their terriers.
- 11. Requests for the measurement of a terrier entered in any class number may be made only by another exhibitor in that same class number or by the Judge EXCEPT in Racing. Requests for the measurement of a terrier in Racing may be made by the Judge or by an exhibitor with a terrier entered in the same class number; OR, if classes are split by gender, may call for a measurement of a terrier of the opposite gender in the same age and height category. (Example: The owner of an under adult dog entered in Racing may call for the measurement of an under adult bitch as the potential exists for them to race each other in the Championship Races.) Exhibitors racing puppies may call for the measurement of a puppy in a different age category as long as it is in the same height category. The person making the request for measurement of the entire class will not be honored. The measurement of the terrier will be considered the terrier's official height for the duration of the trial. Only JRTCA height cards issues after September 1999 will be honored.
- 12. Excessive use of squeaky or fur-like baiting devices by exhibitors is prohibited in the Conformation ring and may result in the exhibitor being excused from the class. "Excessive use" will be at the Judge's discretion.
- 13. Exhibitors participating in the JRTCA Working Terrier Classes, Certificate Go-To-Ground or Super Earth must submit the appropriate JRTCA certificates with pre-entries or at the time of post

entry. The Judge may require a copy of the certificate be presented to the ring/den steward at the time of judging. Registered terriers may submit a copy of NHC certificate signed by a JRTCA Working Judge within 30 days of the date it was issued.

- 14. Puppies under the age of three months are not permitted on the trial grounds. Any person violating this rule will be excused from all classes entered and asked to leave the trial site. (This applies to RV's or campers, if at the same address as the trial grounds). 01/22
- 15. All dogs must be leashed or crated except when competition requires off-leash work. No liberty leashes allowed.
- 16. Overly aggressive dogs or an owner's failure to control his dog may result in disqualification at the discretion of the Judges or the National Trial Administrator.
- 17. The abuse or severe disciplining of dogs on the trial grounds is prohibited. Anyone displaying such behavior will be asked to leave the trial site, and no entry fees will be refunded.
- 18. Dogs other than JRTs on the grounds may be excluded or permitted at the discretion of the Trial Administrator.
- 19. Exhibitors are responsible to be on time for classes entered. No refunds will be given for missed classes.
- 20. The owner/handler of a terrier entering any class does so at his/her own risk and agrees to abide by the rules of the JRTCA and the trial. A copy of the JRTCA Rule Book can be obtained by contacting the JRTCA office (410-561-3655) or it can be downloaded from the JRTCA website (www.terrier.com)
- 21. Unsportsmanlike conduct, or the use of foul and abusive language, will not be tolerated. Anyone demonstrating such conduct will be asked to leave the trial site and no entry fees will be refunded. In addition, such conduct will be subject to penalties, which may include the suspension of membership, restriction from entering the JRTCA National Trial, and/or fines. Trial Chairpersons have the right to refuse any entry at their sole and absolute discretion.
- 22. All dogs brought to JRTCA Sanctioned Trials must be current on vaccinations. No dogs of any age may be brought to a trial who have suspicion of contagious or infectious disease.
- 23. Judges may not eat, smoke, or use cell phones while at their events. (01/22)
- 24. THE JUDGES' DECISIONS ARE FINAL IN ALL DIVISIONS!

Directions to Brooklyn Fairgrounds

The Brooklyn Fair is located at 15 Fairgrounds Road, just off Route 169 in Brooklyn, CT. It approximately 1.5 hr from Boston, 50min from Hartford, 45min from Providence, and 45min from New London.

From the North (Boston, MA)

Follow the Mass Pike (I-90) west to exit 10 (intersection with I-290/I-395) Travel south on I-395 into Connecticut Continue south on I-395 for approximately 16 miles Take exit 37B onto Route 6 west Travel west on Route 6 for approximately 4 miles to the intersection of Route 169 in Brooklyn Turn left onto Route 169 south The Brooklyn Fairgrounds is 1/2 mile ahead

From the West (Hartford, CT)

Travel east on I-84 to I-384 east I-384 becomes Route 6 in Bolton Travel east on Route 6 for roughly 40 minutes until reaching the intersection with Route 169 in Brooklyn Turn right onto Route 169 south The Brooklyn Fairgrounds is 1/2 mile ahead



Class List

Division A. Racing

Racing Rules:

1. SAFETY FIRST: ALL TERRIERS MUST BE MUZZLED! Plastic muzzle or close-ended cloth muzzles only. No figure eight or open-ended muzzles will be allowed. COLORED BASKET AND COLORED SOFTIE MUZZLES ARE NOT ALLOWED. Black, brown, clear, or white muzzles are acceptable. Baskerville muzzles are not allowed. (01/22)

2. Good sportsmanship is encouraged and expected. Poor sportsmanship will not be tolerated. (01/22)

- 3. QUALIFICATIONS FOR CHAMPIONSHIP RUN OFFS
 - A. A terrier MUST ENTER AND FINISH in both, at least one flat race AND one hurdle race at the beginning level based on trial entries (heat, semi, final).
 - B. A terrier must continue to advance, if qualified, to all additional semi-final heats up to the final championship race. If injured, the terrier is then finished and cannot race in the final.
 - C. A FINISHED race is when the terrier runs down the track unassisted (by owner or anyone else) with a secured muzzle to the backside of the barrier.
 - D. Terrier must place first in a flat or hurdle final to qualify for championship run offs. First to the hole is not necessarily first thru the backside of the barrier. (01/22)
 - E. In the event a terrier does not meet all the above criteria, the second place terrier in the final of that class (either flats or hurdles) will qualify for the championship run off if they meet the criteria as outlined above. (01/20

4. GENERAL RACING PROCESS

A. Exhibitors must have entries ready to race, be aware of their classes, and be ready when called. In the event a heat is missed, permission to run in a later heat is granted at the discretion of the racing judge or steward. There are no refunds for missed classes.

B. Once entries are loaded into the starting box, all handlers shall proceed to the finish line/catch area and be ready to receive their terriers. No one may enter the racetrack during a race to assist a terrier across the finish line, any violation of this would result in the terrier being assisted disqualified from the race and thus not considered as finishing that race. If a terrier has not completed the race -AND IS CONSIDERED TO BE NEW (NEWBIE) AT RACING, IT IS AT THE JUDGES DESCRETION TO ALLOW THE HANDLER TO ASSIST THE TERRIER TO FINISH THE RACE. PLACEMENT, IF ANY, IS THE JUDGES DECISION. THIS DOES NOT PERTAIN TO THE PUPPY CLASSES. (01/22)

C. Puppy and Senior hurdles must be run over LOW hurdles.

D. Adult terriers MAY NOT CROSS ENTER between Adult, Veteran and Senior Racing classes.

E. Once the Racing Division has started, NO requests for height measurement will be honored.
Any pre-race height request must be completed by a current standing Conformation judge.
5. **RERUNS** A. In the event of a lure malfunction that alters the forward motion of the race the race will be rerun (lure is caught by a terrier, lure stops, lure gets caught on a hurdle, lure flies off the track) B. At the discretion of the racing judge for any reason

6. **DISQUALIFICATION**

A. In a flat or hurdle race, any entry going around the jumps or jumping out of the racetrack or not wearing a secured muzzle will be disqualified from the race and therefore shown as not finishing that race.

B. Any terrier engaged in fighting shall be disqualified by the Racing Judge from any further racing during the trial. No refund will be given.



Section 3: Championship Run-Offs

No entry fee required. Adult and Veteran run-offs immediately following Class 42.

Class 43: Adult Championship - 10" up to 12½" - 1st place winners of classes 12, 14, 35, & 37 Class 44: Adult Championship - Over 12½" up to 15" - 1st place winners of classes 13, 15, 36, & 38 Class 45: Veteran Championship - 10" up to 12½" - 1st place winners of classes 16,18, 39, & 41 Class 46: Veteran Championship - Over 12½" up to 15" - 1st place winners of classes 17,19, 40 & 42

Division B - Conformation

Conformation Rules:

1. All terriers are to be judged on the JRTCA Breed Standard, unless otherwise noted.

2. Classes may be combined or split at the discretion of the Trial Chairperson.

3. A terrier bred by a Sanctioned JRTCA Judge may not be shown under that Judge in the conformation division.

4. A question concerning the type of coat on any terrier may be made only by another exhibitor in that class, the ring steward or by the judge. Requests for review of coat made by spectators will not be honored.

5. Spayed or neutered terriers may not compete in the Puppy, *Breeder's, Open Adult or Working Conformation section classes. Miscellaneous Conformation section classes are optional and offered at the discretion of the Trial Chairperson. When optional classes are offered, they must be judged by a Sanctioned JRTCA Judge and follow the JRTCA sanctioned trial rules.

* NOTE: For Family classes, Brood Bitches and Stud Dogs entered may not be spayed/neutered. The offspring attheir sides may be intact or spayed/neutered.

6. No cross-entering within the Open Conformation and Working classes.

7. Exhibitors participating in the Working Classes must submit the appropriate JRTCA paperwork with entries. The judge may require a copy of the Natural Hunting Certificate be presented to the Ring Steward at the time of judging.

8. Registered terriers may submit a copy of NHC Application, signed by a JRTCA Working Judge, within 30 days of the date it was issued.

9. Excessive use of squeaky or fur-like baiting devices by exhibitors is prohibited in the Conformation ring. "Excessive use" will be at the judge's discretion.

10. The only individuals permitted in the Conformation Ring, other than class participants, are the Judge, the Ring Steward, and, if asked for by the Judge or Ring Steward, the Trial Chairperson and Trial Photographer. Class participants include one handler per terrier. Terrier must be exhibited on lead.

11. Puppies, 12 months of age and younger, are not eligible to enter any Miscellaneous Conformation or Suitability classes except Spayed/Neutered 6-12 Month Puppy Class, if offered. 12. Saturday conformation judge may show terriers on Sunday at the discretion of the Trial Chairperson.(optional) The Sunday conformation judge must not be near the conformation ring or area on Saturday.



Division C - Go To Ground

- Schooling prior to the competition is not permitted. Any violation of this rule shall result in disqualification from the Go-To-Ground competition at this trial. See posted rules at event.
- Must work quarry continuously for one full minute, without a break in work, unless noted.
- No Adult terrier may compete in the Championship Certificate class until the Trial Certificate has been applied for and issued and received.
- Please be courteous; Let someone run between your dog's when you have more than one.
- <u>Copies of JRTCA GTG trial certificate must be submitted with pre-entries</u> or presented to the den steward at the time of judging in all championship classes.
- <u>Open Puppy & Open Adult, Puppy & Adult Championship classes 1 second per foot of tunnel</u> to reach quarry.
- Cross-entering is not permitted between open and certificate classes.

*****FOR ALL CLASSES; work is defined as baying, digging, concentrated stare, whining or biting at the bars. A break in work is defined as ceasing to work for a period of more than ten seconds. Leaving the quarry is defined as moving back in the tunnel away from quarry and out of the view of the judge. The judge may halt the work if the judge believes the terrier is injuring itself. Terrier is not to leave quarry once it is reached, for all classes.

<u>Class 107</u>: **Pre-Novice Puppy**. Open to pups 4 up to 6 mos. Entry in this class does not affect pup's eligibility to enter Novice class after 6 mos. of age. One min. to reach quarry; mark for 15 seconds without a break in work and without leaving quarry; may leave earth and re-enter until quarry is reached.

<u>Class 108:</u> **Novice Puppy** - Open to JRTs 6 up to 12 months <u>which have not scored 100% in this class at a previous JRTCA trial</u>. Entries earning a score of 100% at this trial <u>may</u>, <u>upon payment of the entry fee</u>, <u>enter the Open Puppy class at this trial</u>. One minute to reach quarry; may leave earth and re-enter several times until quarry is reached; must work quarry for continuously for a full 30 seconds without a break in work and without leaving the quarry; may switch from one type of work to another.

Terriers, puppies, and adults registered or non-registered, which have previously scored 100% in the Novice Class at a JRTCA trial may not, under any circumstances, compete in these classes again, at any JRTCA Sanctioned Trial.

<u>Class 109</u>: **Open Puppy** Open to JRT's 6 up to 12 months <u>which have scored 100% in a Novice Go-To-Ground</u> class at this or a previous JRTCA trial. Puppies earning a score of 100% at this trial <u>may, upon</u> payment of entry fee, enter the Puppy Championship class at this trial, or may continue competing in <u>Open Puppy classes at future trials</u>. One second per foot of tunnel to reach quarry; may leave earth once and re-enter before quarry is reached; must work quarry continuously for one full minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry; may switch from one type of work to another. *Open Puppy GTG is NOT open to any puppy who has competed in Championship GTG at this or any other trial*.

<u>Class 110:</u> **Puppy Championship** Open to JRT pups 6 up to 12 months, <u>which have scored 100% on Open</u> <u>Puppy G-T-G at this or a previous JRTCA trial</u>. A copy of the 100% score sheet must be submitted with a pre-entry or shown to den steward at the time of the class. <u>Puppies may move up to this class on the</u> <u>same day as qualifying in Open G-T-G, upon payment of additional fee</u>. 1st. and 2nd. Place winners will be Puppy G-T-G Champion and Reserve. 1 second per foot of tunnel to reach quarry; may leave earth once and re-enter before quarry is reached; when quarry is reached, must work quarry continuously for one full minute without a break in work and without leaving quarry; may switch from one type of work to another

<u>Class 111</u>: Novice Adult - Open to JRTs one year or older <u>which have not scored 100% in this class at a</u> <u>previous JRTCA trial</u>. Entries earning a score of 100% at this trial <u>may, upon payment of entry fee, enter</u> <u>the Open Adult class at this trial</u>. One minute to reach quarry; may leave earth and re-enter several times until quarry is reached; must work quarry continuously for a full 30 seconds without a break in work and without leaving the quarry; may switch from one type of work to another.

<u>Class 112:</u> Open Adult - Open to terriers, 1 year old or older, registered, or non-registered, which have previously scored 100% in the Open Class, may continue to compete in the Open Adult Class until they receive their Trial Certificate. <u>Class 134:</u> Youth GTG - Open to any youth aged 10 thru 16, handling a Jack Russell Terrier. Judged on the youth's ability to present his/her dog and knowledge of GTG. To be run through the 10 foot Novice liner; time not considered.

<u>Class 135:</u> Youth Off-Lead / On-Lead Agility - Open to any youth aged 10 thru 16, handling a Jack Russell Terrier one year or older. May choose to participate off-or-on lead. . To be run over the Novice Agility course. Time not to be considered. Judged on the youth's ability to handle his/her terrier and knowledge of agility.

<u>Class 136:</u> **Youth Handler High Point and Reserve** - Awarded to the highest scoring youth and runner up in Classes 133, 134 and 135. The points are awarded as follows: 1st = 8 points, 2nd = 6 points, 3rd = 5 points, 4th = 4 points, 5th = 3 points, 6th = 2 points and participation = 1 point. Exhibitors must compete in a minimum of Youth Handling and Youth GTG to qualify for the Youth High Score and Reserve. A tie will be broken with the final decision made by a Conformation Judge other then the Judge of the day. The tie-breaker takes place in the conformation ring and is determined at the Judge's discretion by the exhibitor's handling/presentation of his/her terrier, by the answers to the Judge's questions, or by a combination of the two. If there is no other available Conformation Judge on the grounds, then the Judge of the day will determine the tie-breaker.

<u>Class 137:</u> Novice On-Lead Time YPS 1.50 - Open to any adult terriers that have not scored above 190 points. This class is for the true beginner terrier with the intent of a pleasant experience on the basic agility equipment. Handlers that drag their terriers around will be seriously faulted. Course to include ramps, tunnels, and various hurdles. **(Although this class is for the beginner terrier, you need to have prior exposure to agility equipment.)** Non-Certificate. Handlers may remain in this class. May not enter in Off-Lead Classes at this trial. This course is used for the Youth On - Lead class.

<u>Class 138:</u> Agility I Certificate: Off-Lead. Time 1.75+10% Handlers may remain in this class. Open to any adult terrier. The Agility I Certificates are earned with three scores of 190 or above. Three qualifying scores may move entrant of this class on to Agility II, Agility III, and Jumpers/Game. No cross entering to this class from Agility II and Agility III. This course is used for the Youth Off-Lead. No seesaw or tire jump in this class.

<u>Class 139</u>: Agility II Certificate: Off-Lead. Time 2.25+10% More difficult course to include all of the Agility equipment plus two more hurdles, weave poles, and seesaw. Qualifying Score of 190 or better earns one leg towards JRTCA Agility II Certificate.

<u>Class 140:</u> Agility III Certificate: Off-Lead Time 3.00+10% Course to include all Agility I and II equipment. Weave poles are increased to 12 and must end in a "gamble". Qualifying score will be 200 points. Gamble to be set at 8 to 10 feet.

<u>Class 141:</u> Jumpers/Game Class: Off-Lead Consists of 12-17 jumps and/or tunnels with at least one lead change. Scoring is time plus faults, with lowest score getting 1st regardless of number of faults. Five faults for running course on-lead. Five faults for knocked bar, and off-course. Fifteen faults for a missed obstacle. Qualifying score of 200 earns one leg toward a JRTCA Jumpers/Game Certificate.

<u>Class 142:</u> **Agility High Score and Reserve:** To be awarded to the high score terrier and runner up combining scores of Agility II and Agility III and qualifying no fault score in Jumpers/Games. No entry fee. Ties to be broken by the fastest time.


