(A reflection and prayer on Psalm 76 from Martin Luther)

The 76th psalm is a psalm of thanks, similar to the 46th psalm. For it gives thanks that God has His dwelling, Word, and worship in Jerusalem and that he magnificently protects His people from being devoured by the kings and the rage of warriors such as Sennacherib. God knew how to take courage away from princes and make them discouraged.

In the same way He fights against our enemies. As strong and evil as they may be, it is hard to defend themselves against God, who takes away at once their heart and courage.

Even the devil flees when his courage fails him. What then can flesh and blood do? Such a warrior-God must be praised, who deals thus with the noise of kings. He can save His own without a sword, by fright and fear alone.

76 In Judah God is known; his name is great in Israel. ²His abode has been established in Salem, his dwelling place in Zion.

³There he broke the flashing arrows, the shield, the sword, and the weapons of war. Selah ⁴Glorious are you, more majestic than the mountains full of prey.

⁵The stouthearted were stripped of their spoil; they sank into sleep; all the men of war were unable to use their hands.

⁶At your rebuke, O God of Jacob, both rider and horse lay stunned. ⁷But you, you are to be feared! who can stand before you when once your anger is roused?

¹⁰Surely the wrath of man shall praise you; the remnant of wrath you will put on like a belt.

Let us pray. Thanks to You, Lord Jesus, for planting your Gospel at this place, and gathering a Church that continues in Your Word. Drive far from us the indifference and apathy of these latter evil days. Cause our hearts to burn with zeal for the truth of Your Word, and preserve Your doctrine true at this place, that our children after us may still be praising you. Amen.
