The Season of Pentecost: What Does It Mean?

June 8th is Pentecost Sunday. The Gospel of Luke records that during the celebration of this Old Testament festival (Leviticus 23:15-21) the Holy Spirit was poured out on Jesus' disciples in a visible and extraordinary way. They spoke in many languages so that worshipers from all over the world heard and believed the Gospel and were baptized (Acts 2). We celebrate Pentecost as the completion of the Easter season and the fulfillment of Jesus' promise that He will send the Holy Spirit to His Church (John 14:15-31, 16:5-7).

<u>It's a celebration!</u> Pentecost is the celebration of the Spirit's work, particularly in creating faith in the heart through Holy Baptism and preaching (Acts 2:38). But the Spirit's work is to point to Jesus (John 15:26). So, Pentecost is a festival of Christ. The Christian Church has celebrated Pentecost since at least the third century, perhaps even in apostolic times (Acts 20:16). The color of Pentecost is red, recalling the tongues of fire on the disciples (Acts 2:3).

<u>Second Article of the Apostles' Creed</u>: I believe in the <u>Holy Spirit</u>, the holy Christian church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

<u>What does this mean?</u> I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. In this Christian church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers. On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ. This is most certainly true.
