

## From the desk of Pastor Ken

#### Do you remember your baptism?

Many of you do not because you were young when it happened. Or, maybe some of you do because you were older. Martin Luther's Small Catechism with Explanation (2017, Concordia Publishing: St. Louis) gives us a clearer understanding of and adds scriptural voices to the Sacrament of Holy Baptism.

## What is Baptism?

Baptism is not just plain water, but it is the water included in God's command and combined with God's word.

## Which is that word of God?

Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Matthew: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, from Matt. 28:19, according to the institution of Christ (also read Matt. 3:13-17).

> + As Christians, we are God's baptized people! We are his adopted children, together with all believers, and we live and die in the confidence that he has redeemed us and we are his. +

#### What does the word baptize mean?

Baptize typically means "to wash with water," whether by immersing, pouring, or sprinkling. Christian baptism refers to the washing with water in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit (read Mark 7:4).

#### What is different about the water of Baptism?

The water in itself is not different or holier than any other water, but because "God's Word and command are added to it," it is a "divine water." (Ephesians 5:25-26, Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water and the word.)

#### Who instituted Holy Baptism?

Our Lord Jesus Christ, after his death and resurrection, commanded his church to baptize all nations (in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit). To be baptized in God's name is to be baptized not by men, but by God himself. Therefore, although it is by human hands, it is truly still God's own work. In baptism, God puts his saving name on us and is truly present to bless us with all his gifts and his children as heirs. (read Num. 6:23-27, Exodus 20:24, and 1 Kings 8:27-30, 1 Kings 9:3.)



Did you know that there are benefits to singing? According to an article by Alexandra Moe in the *Washington Post* called "Singing is good for you. Singing with others may be even better," there are many benefits to singing – especially in a group! According to <u>The "Sing With Us" study</u>, singing in the choir is linked to "reduced stress hormones and increased cytokines, proteins that can boost the body's ability to fight serious illness. Other studies have found

a connection between singing generally with lessened anxiety, stimulated memory for those with dementia, increased lung capacity, and an easing of postpartum depression." The article also states that choirs are like large families and singing in them helps contribute to a sense of belonging and joy and that people who sing in choirs are found to be more optimistic, more likely to vote, less lonely, possess stronger relationships, and more likely to contribute positively to their communities than non-singers.

Think you can't sing? "If you can breathe and make sound, you can sing and receive its benefits," says Suze Zumpe, creative director of ENO Breathe.

"Singing has numerous health benefits for older adults too: fewer falls, doctor visits and prescription drugs, better social connections and better cognitive function, according to a study sponsored by the National Endowment for the Arts."


