#### **PRAYER:**

# What Privilege and Command does God give those who believe in Christ?

(from Luther's Small Catechism and "The Lord Will Answer: A Daily Prayer Catechism" from Concordia Publishing: 2004)

In a recent sermon I preached at St. James, I focused on a key part of our weekly worship liturgy: the Kyrie (Lord, have mercy). This short prayer bears the heart and soul of the one who is praying. Luther writes about prayer by answering a series of his own questions included in his Small Catechism.

<u>Matthew 7:7-8</u>: Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be open to you. For everyone who asks receives; he who seeks finds; and to him who knocks, the door will be open.

<u>1 Thessalonians 5:16-18</u>: Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

<u>We Believe</u>: God commands and invites believers in Jesus Christ to pray. The tolling of the church bells is a call to pray at Sunday worship, a death, or other occasions. Pause for prayer in moments of need or bereavement.

<u>Pray</u>: O Lord our God, teach us, we beg You, to ask You aright for the right blessings. Steer the vessel of our life toward Yourself, O tranquil haven of all storm-tossed souls. Show us the course wherein we should go. Renew a willing spirit within us. Let Your Spirit curb our wayward senses, and guide and enable us unto that which is our true good, to keep Your laws, and in all our works evermore to rejoice in Your glorious and gladdening Presence. For yours is the glory and praise from all Your saints forever and ever. Amen. (Basil of Caesarea, c. 330-79)

#### **GOD'S GIFT OF MUSIC**

What helps you sort out what you're feeling, or experience an emotion more deeply? What allows you to let loose and cry, or fully celebrate when you're joyful? Nature helps some of us get in touch with our feelings, perhaps because it removes us from screens and other distractions.

But when getting out isn't possible — no mountain lake is nearby, or the weather isn't tranquil — consider the gift of music. Often instrumental or vocal music helps us access the depths of our soul like nothing else can.

God may even speak to us through music — whether in song lyrics, our own inner thoughts or wordless stirrings of the heart.

Albert Schweitzer, a pastor, musicologist, physician and more, said, "Joy, sorrow, tears, lamentation, laughter — to all these music gives voice, but in such a way that we are transported from the world of unrest to a world of peace, and see reality in a new way, as if we were sitting by a mountain lake and contemplating hills and woods and clouds in the tranquil and fathomless water."

Make some playlists for various emotions: joy, grief, anxiety, hope. Then imagine yourself relaxing in nature, and experience God's love.







