PASTOR KEN, I HAVE A QUESTION:

What is the Season of Epiphany?

After the twelve days of Christmas, we begin the Season of Epiphany on January 6th. It's often referred to as the "Season of Light" because it represents the appearance or manifestation of

Christ. Since the Church Calendar begins with Advent, there is the unfolding theme of Jesus' identification: from his birth, to the arrival of the Magi, to Jesus' presentation in the temple, his baptism, then first miracle at Cana. Basically, during the Season of Epiphany we see Jesus the Christ as cute baby in a manger to miracle maker (as human and divine).

Epiphany in Luke's Gospel signals the arrival of the shepherds at the stable after hearing the angelic announcement. However, Matthew's Gospel has a focus on the Magi visiting the Christ child after seeing the star.

According to tradition (not from the bible), the shepherds and Magi meet at the manger all together at the manger as one group. Also, tradition says that there was possibly twelve Magi, one for each of the tribes of Israel. Although the age and nationality of the Magi are not known, it is consistent that Matthew's intention is to tell us that Jesus is the Messiah for all people of all nations.

As for the wisemen themselves, well, stay tuned to a future children's sermon and I'll share their traditional names. Have a blessed Epiphany!




