Evangelism:

Enlarging the Fishing Club at Your Church

(a few words on evangelism from Rev. Royal Speidel, "Ministry in the Small Membership Church")

<u>Peter was a professional fisherman</u>, who Jesus said would become a fisher of people. Instead of pulling in large numbers of

fish with nets, Peter would be used to reach huge numbers of people for God. His workplace would shift from a boat in the water to the dust on the street. New work tools would be needed.

<u>Nets would be replaced with words</u>. The incentive would be reversed. His goal had been to put fish to death for food; now it would be to give the bread of life to people. The talkative Peter, who had told funny stories to pass time in the boat, would now tell eternal stories to change lives. Joining Peter would be eleven others whom Jesus enlisted into this fishing club.

<u>Healthy, growing churches</u> around the world constantly work at enlarging Jesus' fishing club. Jesus needs people today who are willing to change the way they are spending their time, in order to invest it in bringing people to faith in Jesus Christ. For most laity it will mean not so much leaving a job, but changing what they talk about on the job and how they spend their leisure time.

<u>The larger number of people in a church</u> who are excited about sharing with others the new life Jesus gives people, the faster that church will grow. Enlarging the fishing club expands the kingdom of God and the church.
