ASK THE PASTOR

PASTOR KEN, I HAVE A QUESTION.

WHY IS THE FIRST PART OF JOHN'S GOSPEL REFERRED TO AS "THE PROLOGUE?"

Great question. You're referring to <u>John 1:1-18</u>. Notice that the birth of Christ is not mentioned in these opening verses. Instead, John goes all the way back to the beginning of time with the emphasis on The Word (see verses 1 and 2). I've broken the text into sections so you can see how Christ, God's Son, one with the Father, both hu-

man and divine, has been with us from the very beginning.

THE DIETY OF JESUS CHRIST

^{verse 1}In the beginning was the <u>Word</u>, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ²He was in the beginning with God.

THE PREINCARNATE WORK OF THE SON OF GOD

^{verse 3}All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being ⁴in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. ⁵The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not over-<u>come it</u>.

WITNESS OF JOHN THE BAPTIST

^{verse 6}There was a man sent from God, whose name <u>was John. ⁷He came as a witness to testify to the light</u>, so that all might believe through him. ⁸He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light.

JESUS CHRIST, THE TRUE LIGHT: REJECTED AND RECEIVED

^{verse 9}The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. ¹⁰He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. ¹¹He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. ¹²But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, ¹³who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God.

THE WORD MADE FLESH

^{verse14}And <u>the Word became flesh and lived among us</u>, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. ¹⁵(John testified to him and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.'")

<u>A HOLY HERITAGE</u>

^{verse16} <u>From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace.</u> ¹⁷ The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. ¹⁸No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known.

Text:John 1:1-18, The "Prologue" (ESV)Opening:Who is the "Word" (Greek = logos)?What do we know about the Word from verses 1-5?What do we know about the Word from verses 10-18?What "fails to comprehend the light" in verses 5, 10-11?

Key verse: (v. 5) A light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

Word origin: Greek (kata-lam-bano)

Other English translations:

- (NIV) ----but the darkness has not <u>understood</u> it.
- (KJV) ----and the darkness <u>comprehended</u> it not.
- (NRSV) --- and the darkness did not overcome it.
- (GNB) --- and the darkness has <u>never put it out</u>.
- (NLT) ...and the darkness can never <u>extinguish</u> it.
- (NCV) \dots and the darkness has not **<u>overpowered</u>** it.

The **Evangelism Committee** will meet on Wednesday, Sept. 13th at 6:30 p.m. in the Fellowship Building.



About the tickets

Tickets are monetary donations accepted for reserved seating. Each ticket covers entry into the event and includes a brunch buffet, live musical entertainment and a ballot to vote for their favorite table. The winning table host will receive a prize. Each host will receive 7 tickets to sell to your family and friends. Table Host will be responsible for keeping up with donations and turning them in to Lori or Sherrie at the church office. All proceeds will go towards our Playground Fund.

Guidelines for decorating and hosting a table

1. Each table will seat 8 people and must be set with 8 place settings. The round tables are 5ft diameter. A white plastic tablecloth will be provided, however, you may use a different table covering,

appropriately sized, that better supports your table theme.

2. Each host is responsible for decorating the table in a festive theme of their choosing. Be as creative and elaborate as you would like. The sky's the limit.

3. Centerpieces should not be too large and obtrusive where your guest will not be able to see across the room and the stage area of entertainment.

4. Each table host is responsible for providing one brunch item for the buffet. Examples: quiche, casseroles, fruit, muffins, etc.

5. No electricity will be provided for the tables but you can utilize battery operated candles and lights. Please avoid regular candles that can cause a fire hazard.

6. Please utilize the Parade of Tables check off list attached to prepare your table setup. We will provide clear plastic plates for serving the meal, that will overlay your place setting. This will help eliminate plate clean up. Your utensils and glassware should be the only part you will need to clean up.

7. Decorating times: Friday, September 29th and Saturday, Sept 30th -8:00 am to 9:30am All setup and decorating must be completed by 9:45am on Saturday, September 30th. If you need access to the

Fellowship building on Friday please schedule with Lori 828-320-1922 **8.** There will be a preview of tables from 10 AM to 10:30AM. This is when voting for best table will take place. Each host is required to arrive no later than 9:45 AM, September 30th, to welcome your guests.

9. Each host will be responsible for completely clearing their table at the end of the event - packing up and removing all table settings and decorations. However, we ask that you do not begin any clean up until we adjourn the program.
